## ARIZONA ELECTION ALERT

Election time is nearing, and once again it is time to be sorting out who our friends are, and who we should try to defeat because of their anti-Gay voting habits. AGN has already carried an article on the District 9 State Senate race, where Carlos Gonzalez deserves our full support.

Another race especially important to Gay people is the House race in District 7. This is a largely rural district, containing part of Nogales, most of the Papago reservation of central Pima County, and reaching up into Pinal County to San Manuel. And that's where our trouble lies, for that is the home of "maximum homophobe" State Representative Marge Ollison. Demurely parading through the halls of the Capitol, smugly secure in her "knowledge" that she knows no Gays - it turns out she for sure does; it's just that she has scared them so badly they are afraid of telling her. Ms. Ollison is facing strong opposition in her primary race for the Democratic nomination. The Gay-rights stand of her two opponents is presently unknown (AGN questionnaires are in the mail), but since she does have this primary opposition, it gives us two chances to defeat her. Her Democratic opponents are incumbent Dick Pacheco of Nogales and newcomer Peter Rios of Gayden. Every kind of support should be given these two men - and tell them where it's coming from.


The most crowded primary race in the state legislative Democratic races is the five-way race in Tucson's District 10. Incumbent Carmen Cajero is running again and usually returns to the House purely on the strength of goodwill and the reputation of her long deceased husband. But the decision of the other incumbent, liberal Democrat House Minority Leader Larry Bahill, to seek a different elective office this term is a great loss to Gay people in Arizona. Larry has been one of the few voices of vehement opposition to the hide-bound Republican House leadership, and bills such as the Trudy Camping "dildo" proposal incurred his vocal wrath when few others would speak out against them. His absence in the next session could hurt us badly.

Of those in the District 10 race with Cajero and trying to fill the Bahill vacancy, Doug Shakel is the most likely to be a strong supporter of Gay rights issues. Shakel has been active in Tucson affairs for nearly a decade, although most of his activism has concerned itself with environmental and other non-social affairs. He is a teacher and a scientist, but has a strong interest in young people. His liberal pronouncements on some issues may scare off conservatives, but the other Democrats in this race are unlikely to be helpful on Gay issues. A possible exception is Jesus Higuera.

Shakel is easily approachable in Gay affairs, and is willing to be contacted to discuss his stands on any issues you might be concerned about. He is unlikely to crusade for Gay rights reform in his first weeks in the legislature, but he can certainly be looked to for leadership in chipping away at the more vulnerable aspects of the state criminal code in those areas which oppress Lesbians and Gay men and others in this state. He appears to be non-sexist, and he is very dedicated to passage of the ERA. He considers the matter of abortion to be mainly a matter for women to decide, and it is generally none of the governments business at all.

The main problem Shakel has at this point are: a crowded field of opponents; a race that is all over with the primary (no Republicans are running and there will be only one Libertarian in the general election); and most seriously a shortage of funds. District 10 is a hotbed of voter apathy, and only media and money will get Shakel the name recognition necessary to win. Here is a classic case where the entire Arizona Gay Community could really put its money where its mouth sometimes is by sending him a check. ## House passes anti-Gay amendment

WASHINGTON, DC - The United States House of Representatives has passed, by a surprisingly large margin of 290 to 113, an amendment to the Legal Services Corporation appropriations legislation (H.R. 7584) designed to prohibit the Legal Services Program from handling Gay-related cases, according to the Gay Rights National Lobby. The amendment offered by the anti-Gay leader Larry McDonald (D-GA), took place on July 22. Although the amendment occurred on the floor without official advance word, the Gay Rights National Lobby (GRNL) had predicted it and has issued a "Congressional Action Alert" (among other actions) to try to defeat it. A similar amendment to the Legal Services Program passed in 1977 by 230 to 133.

The increased margin of loss can be partially attributed to the political paranoia that has overwhelmed the Congress in this election year. A number of other factors probably played a role in the wide margin of loss. They include: (1) the general political climate which seems to be swinging away from social justice issues; (2) the wording of the 1980 amendment, which alludes to "promoting" homosexuality, and therefore frames the issue in a very difficult way for pro-justice forces; and (3) the wide discrepancy between the funds available to the anti-Gay lobbies in Congress and those available to the only full-time Gay/Lesbian lobby in Congress. Moral Majority and Christian Voice are budgeted for \$8 million this year while the Gay Rights National Lobby was only able to raise \$50,000 last year.

GRNL Executive Director Steve Endean described the amendment as part of the election year strategy of Christian Voice, Moral Majority and the rest of the "New Right". "In addition to enacting anti-Gay legislation, the amendment was designed to force a role call vote on the issue so it could be used against pro-Gay members of Congress," Endean said. Even as GRNL prepared to fight to delete the amendment from

### SAN FRANCISCO FOR JESUS???

SAN FRANCISCO (GCN) - Buoyed by the success of last April's Washington for Jesus march and rally, one of its organizers is planning an anti-Gay crusade in San Francisco as part of a series of Christian rallies in the nation's 250 largest cities. The Associated Press reports that Rev. John Giminez hopes millions of Christians throughout the country will attend the rallies. One Nation Under God, a political Christian corporation formed by Giminez, will sponsor the rallies.

The Washington Rally sponsored by One Nation Under God along with other Christian lobbies, including Christian Voice and Moral Majority drew an estimated 200,000 marchers. John Gillman, vice president of One Nation Under God, told AP that the group also hopes evangelists Oral Roberts and Billy Graham will join the crusade.

"We feel this is an historic time, a time to merge together all the followers of Christ to turn this nation away from sin and in the direction of goodness," Gillman said. He said that the rallies will begin later this year and continue into 1981. He said they will feature major Christian personalities along with local ministers. A multi-media show is also being prepared, he said.

### PHOENIX MAN SHOT IN ROBBERY

PHOENIX - On Wednesday night, July 30, approximately 4:00 a.m. while working at an all-night store in Glendale, Jim Karkula was shot and severely wounded in a robbery attempt. Jim was formerly an assistant manager at Casa de Roma. The slow arrival of the Glendale police and fire departments complicated his wounds. The owner of the store and Workman's Compensation will assist in the necessary plastic surgery that must be done to restore Karkula's right bicep which was completely destroyed. Almost every bar owner in Phoenix has sent flowers to Karkula. We wish him a speedy recovery.

#### FAT ACTIVISTS TOGETHER

MINNEAPOLIS, MN (GCN) - Fat Activists Together, a national coalition of feminist/Lesbian-feminist fat liberation activists, is planning daily workshops and support groups at the 1980 Michigan Womyn's Music Festival. Workshops planned include "Fat Is Beautiful: An Introduction to Fat Liberation," including a consciousness raising and discussion about "health" myths, diets, and the oppression of fat women to dance, move, and enjoy their bodies; and "The Goddess is Fat," a political, social and spiritual analysis of fat oppression, followed by discussion and a ritual for fat women.

Support groups will be held daily at the tipi in the chemical-free camping area at the festival. The groups will include, according to the organizers, "discussions, togetherness, and support for each other as we all try to cope with feelings of isolation, self-consciousness and oppression among thousands of thin women at the festival." #### NYC POST OFFICE DENIES PERMIT

NEW YORK, NY - U.S. Postal Service officials have denied a bulk mailing permit to Presbyterians for Lesbian/Gay Concerns. In a letter to Jim Anderson, head of PLGC, post office officials conceded that the group did have tax-exempt status. But they added, "In our opinion, there is nothing in the material submitted.... to substantiate that PLGC is religious within the meaning of our definition." The postal service maintains that a non-profit religious organization is one whose primary purpose is to conduct religious worship or to further the teachings of particular religious faiths or tenets. Anderson called the decision "absurd" and said he will appeal it.

the bill in Senate sub-committee, Endean admitted that the task would be extremely difficult. "Although we have a chance of deleting the amendment when the bill goes into Senate sub-committee, there is still a very real chance of a floor amendment to re-insert it, and, if this is a part of an election year strategy by the Right, as suspected, such a floor amendment seems almost certain," Endean said.

GRNL pointed out that the anti-Gay amendment to the Legal Services Bill is just one section of the "Family Protection Act" and predicted that enactment of this amendment could release a floodgate of similar amendments, just as it has on the abortion issue. And, like the Legal Services amendment, they could cut off Gay access to various government programs.

To combat these threats, the Gay Rights National Lobby urged several actions: (1) Letters to your Senators urging support for basic civil rights for Gays and opposition to any anti-Gay amendments. Write: The Honorable \_\_\_\_\_, Senate Office Building, Washington, DC 20510. (2) Collect the names, addresses, and phone numbers of as many Gay rights supporters as possible and send them to GRNL to help them build a National Constituent Network to assist in generating pro-Gay constituent mail to Congress. (3) Join or contribute to the Gay Rights National Lobby. "The political times are obviously very difficult and the threat that our progress to date may be eroded is a very serious one. To do the job necessary, we simply must have stronger support from the Gay and Lesbian communities. We will not be able to match their efforts when we can raise just \$50,000 while the opposition has \$8 million available." Membership dues are \$20 and above, and contributions may be sent to GRNL, P.O. Box 1892, Washington, DC 20013.

## Prospective MCC pastor arrives

TUCSON - Truth Chapel MCC will be hosting the Rev. F. Randall Hill, who will be candidating for the vacant pulpit there. He will be in Tucson August 9 through 18. Rev. Hill has been in the professional ministry of the Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Community Churches since 1977 when he founded the Knoxville, Tennessee MCC. He served as "Assistant District Coordinator of South Atlantic District" of the UFMCC, and some of his other duties included mental health work, bar ministry, Charismatic Prayer Meetings and Weekday Education. While in Knoxville he started the "Knoxville Gay Council" and organized their first Gay Pride Week activities, also he worked with the University of Tennessee's operation of Gay Community Center crisis lines.

From Knoxville, Rev. Hill moved on to the position as pastor at the Sarasota, Florida MCC. He has had many pastoral duties at that church including being District Area Representative for the Prison Ministry, and he has worked with various motorcycle clubs as chaplain. He participated in "Trek To Tallahassee" (the longest march in history for Gay rights - 168 miles) and "March on Tallahassee". He has been involved with radio, television, newspaper, college classes, police academy education, mental health and crisis line counseling for the community, and was appointed Minister for Special Olympics 1979 for a five county area around Sarasota.


Rev. Hill received his B.A. degree from Oklahoma Baptist University in Shawnee, Oklahoma. He received a Master's degree in religious education from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky. His other training has included continuing education studies with Yale University. The congregation of Truth Chapel is very excited that such a gifted person is candidating for their pulpit. They wish to do all they can to make him welcome, and hope that he will like Tucson.

## baptists protest Gay convention

MEMPHIS, TN (AP) - A Baptist preacher carrying a sign reading "God Hates Sodomites" led 500 followers in a demonstration last Saturday, August 3, outside a hotel where homosexuals were holding a convention. Except for the protesters breaking ranks occasionally to pass out religious pamphlets to the Gays or to debate the Bible, the two sides kept their distance as police stood by. The Rev. Charles Britt, pastor of Thrifthaven Baptist Church of Memphis and president of the Fellowship of Mid-South Fundamentalists, led his hymn-singing, placard-carrying followers outside the Holiday Inn-Rivermont for an hour in the 93-degree heat.

Standing beneath the hotel's entrance canopy, about 200 Gays retorted with hymns of their own and shouts of "Gay Pride". An unidentified male held a sign above his head which said, "Don't Hide Us From Your Children Because We Are Your Children". Another counter-protester beside him held a sign that said, "Baptist-Gay And Proud". The Fifth Annual Southeastern Conference of Lesbians and Gay men, sponsored by the Tennessee Gay Coalition for Human Rights, opened Aug. 2 at the Rivermont, a luxury hotel overlooking the Mississippi River.

The conference ended on Sunday with a religious service and discussion of Gay support for independent presidential candidate John Anderson. Charlie McMullen, 23, of Memphis, a member of the Tennessee Gay Coalition, said there is an organized effort among Gays to support Anderson's presidential bid. "He has been the most open about Gay rights and Gay people," McMullen said.







## Gay political power being felt at all levels

NEW YORK — If the delegate rosters to the Democratic National Convention opening here next week are any guide, the gay political movement in America has "come out of the closet" and made impressive forward strides in the past four years.

Thirty-seven avowedly homosexual men and women will be Democratic delegates — compared to just two in 1976. Dozens of other gays are among the party's alternates and platform committee members.

The proposed Democratic platform contains, for the first time in history, a proposed gay-rights plank.

Republicans are approaching the controversial area of open homosexuality in public life more gingerly. There were two gay GOP delegates in Detroit — scarcely a landslide, but up from zero four years ago. The Republican platform endorses the implicitly anti-gay Family Protection Act introduced by Ronald Reagan's campaign director, Sen. Paul Laxalt, and others. Yet one of the Republicans' own, born-again Christian John Anderson, has enthusiastically embraced the gay-rights cause in his independent presidential race.

The rise of gay activism in national poli-

tics, however surprising to many, is simply an upward percolation of a movement strikingly obvious in city elections over the past decade. Whether the city be Minneapolis or Houston, Boston or Portland, Philadelphia or Seattle, gays have become major voting blocs and have begun to wring concessions from local governments.

Typical demands: to pass anti-discrimination laws in employment and housing, appointment of gays to prominent government posts, protection from police harassment, equal access to credit and public accommodations.

The gay-rights movement initially appeared to have suffered a major setback with the Miami repeal of a gay-rights ordinance. But that vote, spearheaded by Anita Bryant, and duplicated in Boulder, Colo., St. Paul, Minn., Wichita, Kan., and Eugene, Ore., seems in retrospect to have been a last gasp of openly anti-gay politics.

Millions of gays became fearful — and then mobilized — by the Miami reversal, as well as by the TV film "Holocaust," which showed homosexuals being herded to their deaths in Nazi concentration camps. A turning point came in Seattle a few months

later when gays decisively defeated an at-

tempted repeal of that city's anti-discrimi-

nation law. The outcome is that gay rights are still protected in 42 cities, many of them college towns but also such places as Detroit, Atlanta and Minneapolis.

A gay political action group in Los Angeles — a city some believe might elect a gay congressman in the '80s — has raised \$150,000 for favored candidates since 1977. San Francisco is unsurpassed as the hot-house — and potential flashpoint — of gay advances.

The flourishing of gay political activism in cities should be no surprise: In contrast to suburbs and their family social norms, cities offer freedom, anonymity, varieties of entertainment and culture. As city neighborhoods began to experience revival in the '70s, male gays were often at the forefront, braving peripheral ghetto "combat zones" long before others.

If the establishment media have often ignored the growing gay influence in city neighborhoods, politicians have not. And even in some cities one would least imagine. In booming, masculine Houston, gays began the revitalization of Montrose and other trendy inner-city areas, formed a gay political caucus in 1975, and have helped several candidates win election.

Last autumn, gays backed Eleanor Tinsley, a prominent Baptist layperson, to defeat a 20-year incumbent Houston councilman, Frank Mann, who openly attacked

homosexuals as "queers" and "perverts."

The gays provided 1,500 volunteers to Tinsley's campaign.

The message? On economic issues, at least, gay votes could easily split between liberal and conservative in the '80s. But the Republicans with their current New Right fundamentalist doctrine shut themselves off from a new, politically activist, influential force in grassroots politics.
