Slayings Suspect Named

SAN MATEO, CA - County authorities here named a former convicted killer being held in a San Francisco jail as a suspect in three of five murders of homosexual men that have alarmed San Francisco's Gay community this year.


The suspect, David Likens, 31, of San Francisco and a former resident of Tucson, is being held on charges of assault and attempted murder stemming from separate incidents in San Francisco. San Mateo county officials during the last eight months have found the strangled and beaten bodies of five young men - two of whom still lie unidentified in the county morgue - in remote and brushy areas of the county.

Sheriff's officials named Likens as a suspect in the killings of the identified victims after a months-long investigation in which law enforcement agents visited the predominately Gay areas in San Francisco. Likens, who served time in San Quentin prison from 1975 to Nov. 8, 1977 as a result of a conviction for a killing in Los Angeles was on parole at the time of his October 12 arrest in connection with other charges resulting from homosexual assaults in the Tenderloin.

The latest victim, A. Tomlin Goodwin III, 26, of San Francisco was found October 6 in a sleeping bag in a ravine near Tuunitas creek in San Gregorio. The body was found by a hiker about 100 yards from where the bodies of the two unidentified men were found last June. All of the deceased, authorities said, had links to San Francisco's Gay community.

Deputy District Attorney Cliff Cretan said Likens' victims in the assault cases helped link him to the murders but he declined to give further details. San Francisco officials, who had planned to try Likens on local charges on January 8, said they would turn him over to San Mateo law-enforcement agents, at their request, for him to be prosecuted on the three, more serious, charges.

Likens was very well known in the Tucson Gay community between 1972 and 1974.

Co-sponsored by the Tucson Chapter of the National Lesbian Feminist Organization (NLFO) and the Women's Company Job Development Project, the variety show will begin at 8:00 p.m. with performances by the Edison Street Jug Band, the comedy team of Bobbi and Barbi, singer-songwriter-guitarist Judy Nicholson, as well as West African/Jazz dancer Karen McLean accompanied by Conga Drummers Linda Coronade, Barbara Bird and Cocoa as well as poet Tyshaun Lane.

Dancing will begin at 10:00 p.m. with the beautiful music of Lady Jazz followed by dancing to all types of recorded music such as disco, country swing, latin, soul, "oldies" and reggae. Other happenings of interest include a Twist and Limbo Contest.

Admission is from \$3.00 to \$5.00 depending on how much each woman can afford to pay for this benefit event. Food and drinks will be available.



News Briefs

TOYS FOR KIDS DRIVE HUGE SUCCESS

TUCSON - The culmination of three weeks of intensive work on the part of the entire Gay community of Tucson proved that it was more than worth the effort. Margo Cowan, President of the Manzo Area Council, was presented with a huge load of toys, food and money to be distributed to the underprivileged children living in the Manzo Area.

A Saturday night show at Hair Tiz resulted in a full house of satisfied customers and a couple of hundred pounds of foodstuffs, as well as toys and stocking stuffers, which were delivered to Jekyll's in time for Cindi Diamond's bash there Sunday night. All the toy boxes that had been in the bars and organizations were collected and when placed around the Christmas tree on stage, it looked for sure that the Manzo kids were in for a very merry Christmas indeed. At the end of an excellent show, Ms. Cowan was given the door receipts for the evening which amounted to over four hundred dollars. In addition to the Hair Tiz contribution, Jekyll's, Joshua Tree and Graduate each donated money to the cause.

The Tucson community really came through in great style this time, and each of you deserve a heartfelt thanks for the magnificent job. The two coordinators for this effort also deserve a big pat on the back - Cindi Diamond and Jim Smith. Great going people, you all have made a bunch of kids very happy at this yuletide season.

MORE ON ERA

WASHINGTON - The U.S. Civil Rights Commission has reaffirmed its support of the Equal Rights Amendment by noting what it says is the progress made by 14 states that have put similar measures into their state constitutions.

The commission released a report recently that notes ERA opponents fears of "coed bathrooms," forced recognition of homosexual marriages and threats to religious institutions and says these things haven't happened in states where "equal rights provisions patterned after the federal ERA have been added to state constitutions." The report also cited "substantial strides toward equality of men and women" in employment, education, criminal law and civil law in the 14 states.

PHOENICIAN DEAD OF HEART ATTACK

PHOENIX - Richard Orzechowski, noted member of the Phoenix Gay community, died suddenly in his home early Sunday morning, December 10, of a massive coronary. Death came very suddenly, according to medical authorities.

Orzechowski, 48, was known to many in the Phoenix area through his proprietorship of Jerome Richards Flowers. In earlier years he had been a skating instructor and opera singer and enthusiast. His singing was well known to patrons of the Boardwalk piano bar. His body was shipped back east for interment, and no local services were held.

A special benefit will be held on New Year's Day at the Boardwalk to benefit his lover, Jim, to help him meet debts left by the deceased. Interested friends will find further details of the benefit in next week's paper, or may inquire at the Boardwalk.

DRIVER SENTENCED IN CAR DEATH

TUCSON - A 19-year-old man who pleaded guilty to a vehicular manslaughter charge in the July death of Barry L. White, was sentenced to six months in jail and two years probation. Todd Wayne Large also was ordered by Superior Court Judge Robert B. Buchanan to attend the state traffic survival school.

Large was arrested after driving his car through a stop sign and colliding with the car driven by White at North Miracle Mile and West Glenn Street on July 7. White, a popular member of the Tucson Gay community, died shortly after at St. Mary's Hospital.

Perspective

On a Sunday morning 21 years ago, my mind wandering from the usual fare of "hellfire and damnation" thundering from the pulpit, I looked over a congregation sitting in smug piety murmuring "Amen" at every opportunity, and I thought: "Yes, and I know you on Monday morning, too." With that, I got up and left.

I was only 16 then, but I knew that I wanted no part of a "religion" that carries with it the hatred to be found among Baptists and other fundamentalists. I was reared a Southern Baptist, a member of the First Baptist Church from the time I was a toddler, twice baptized in that church, and two-up on Anita Bryant -- I had read the Bible through twice before I was 16; she hasn't read it once, yet.

I know where "Christian charity" stops; I know where it has never been; and I want no part of it or them. If the likes of Batema, Angwin and Bryant cannot find an issue such as Gays on which to predicate sermons of hatred, they will turn that inherent negativism on their own congregations. Masochistically, those congregations lap it up, "amening" their way through a Sunday morning of mental flagellation that satisfies their egos or libidos, or both. Never much of a masochist, I've spent the last two decades trying to keep their claws out of my throat.

Thanks to the Founding Father of this country in having had the foresight to write the First Amendment onto the Constitution to prevent just such a church-state as fundamentalists want to establish, that battle had been pretty much a personal one. Now, going for total control, the fundamentalists make no bones about their goals: to do away with the Constitution and establish the Bible -- their interpretation -- as law. On a KQED Special Report, September 20, 1978, in response to a question by reporter Randy Shilts as to which should govern, the Bible or the Constitution, John Briggs unhesitatingly answered 'the Bible' -- his version, of course.

I am not a teacher. In that sense, Proposition 6 would not affect my life one way or another. But Proposition 6 was not, nor has it ever been, an issue of "Gay

schoolteachers." Not even its proponents were able to keep up that sham. Rather, in that same KQED Special Report, only once in 15 minutes did the word "schoolteacher" crop up. The rest of that time did no more than provide a forum for Briggs, Batema and Ruegsegger to propound their collective stupidity about Gays.

And I am sick and tired of listening to their collective stupidity. I am from there. Despite that Baptist upbringing, I still am Gay, and I became aware of it during the time I was a member of the Baptist church. I had no Gay teachers. I made no "choice" to be Gay, I don't give a damn what Anita Bryant says. I did not leave the church to become Gay; I left the church because I am Gay and there is no place for Gays in that pit of "Christian charity." Proposition 6 was no more than a facade behind which John Briggs hoped to ride to "folk herodom," and with which its proponents are trying to extend their stupidity beyond their church and into the state.

Though we hear a lot about Gays' efforts to "recruit" others, in reality, the reverse is true. I was not (nor was anyone that I know) "recruited" into being Gay; I was "recruited" into the Baptist church at a very early age. Having been an inside member of that group, it is not difficult to understand the mentality at work projecting their own "recruiting" efforts off onto others. Recruitment is the name of the game, and it would be difficult to count the number of sermons I have sat through as congregations were ordered to give more and more money to get missionaries off to somewhere or another before someone else got there. For the fundamentalists, "recruiting" is a way of life, and it is inconceivable to them that there is anyone out there not trying to "recruit." Failing "recruitment," they are just as content to impose their beliefs and lifestyles on others, and it is not surprising that they have picked Gays as their first target.

Despite Anita Bryant's *Playboy* "interview" claim of 'heavenly orgasms,' you will hear a lot among that group about "original sin." For the uninitiated, "original sin" is not when Eve disobeyed God's command not to eat of the fruit of the tree of life. "Original sin" is, rather, S-E-X. From that, "conceived in sin," and "missionary position" are but logical spinoffs. To them, sex is dirty, something you do in the dark, get it over with quickly, and pretend that it never happened. Hopefully, it won't happen

NGTF ANNOUNCES CORPORATE SURVEY RESULTS


NEW YORK - According to a survey conducted by the National Gay Task Force, 121 of the nation's largest industrial corporations, employing over seven million workers and representing nearly 600 billion dollars in annual revenue, now state that they do not discriminate on the basis of sexual orientation in hiring and promotions. The list includes such corporate giants as AT&T, Bethlehem Steel, DuPont, Exxon, Firestone, Ford, General Electric, General Motors, Gulf Oil, Gulf and Western- IBM, Mobil Oil, Rockwell International, Texaco, Union Carbide, Western Electric and Xerox. A complete list appears elsewhere in this issue.

As part of its ongoing Corporate Employment Project NGTF sent inquiries last August to all of the country's major industrial corporations, plus a selected list of non-industrials. To date, NGTF reports that 135 replies have been received, with only 14 of the respondents indicating that they have no policy with regard to discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation, and none of the respondents indicating that a discriminatory policy exists.

According to NGTF co-executive director Jean O'Leary there are a variety of reasons for the substantial increase in statements of corporate non-discrimination. "For one thing", O'Leary said, "the passage of civil-rights legislation in more than 40 communities has forced employers to examine their own policies. It's also true that employers are much more aware than they used to be of the number of Gay people they already have in their employ, and the economic loss they would face by failing to provide these individuals with job security. The recent 'backlash' has also helped, by helping to demonstrate the amount of discrimination which lesbians and Gay men actually do face."

Co-Executive Directors Bruce Voeller and O'Leary stressed that while adoption and dissemination of corporate policies of non-discrimination will continue to be a major NGTF priority, such activity is in no way seen as a substitute for efforts to obtain civil-rights legislation on the federal, state and local level. "We see these projects," Voeller said, "as two parts of a single goal: to end, once and for all, all public and private employment discrimination against lesbians and Gay men."

again, but if it does, go back to 'dirty' and start over. If anyone ever invents a way to avoid 'conceiving in sin,' you can bet that bunch will be the first to storm the suppliers for the 'miracle' that will deliver them from their first insufferable condition.

Burdened as they are with heinous self-abasement at having been 'conceived in sin,' and of the biological necessity of wallowing in "original sin" for gratification and reproduction, it is but one easy step for them to turn that self-hatred onto others: Gays. We are, in reality, but opposite sides of the same coin: fundamentalists are determined to wipe out 'sin' ("original sin" = sex); Gays are identified by sexual orientation (sex = original sin"); fundamentalists are out to exterminate Gays. It has been a 1,978-year battle, and they have devised some rather hideous methods in their attempts to achieve that goal.

Until Anita Bryant and her "religious" cohorts began their campaign of hatred and bloodshed, it had been a long, long time since anyone had called me a "queer." Yet as late as 1977, the Miami Gay civil rights campaign produced bumper stickers reading "Kill A Queer For Christ." And though I was reared a Southern Baptist, I could never get used to calling people "human garbage;" fundamentalists with their "Christian charity" have no such compunctions. It's always easier to murder someone else than to murder yourself.

They whip their congregations into a murderous frenzy, screaming that if God had intended Gays, He would have made "Adam and Bruce." To accept that premise, I would have to view God as cruelly sadistic for having put me here merely to become target practice for the likes of John Briggs or Anita Bryant. I can accept the fallibility of man; I can accept the stupidity of Batema, Briggs and Bryant; but I presume God knows what He is doing and I am here -- Gay.

They cover their nihilistic intentions behind the cry to "protect the children," and no one would argue with that. But I also remember back to a time when I was a child, and a Baptist, growing up Gay and alone, in the midst of the very hatred and stupidity that we saw at work around Proposition 6. I had to muddle through alone with not only the usual problems of adolescence, but the added


THE EROTIC FILMS OF PETER DE ROME

THE EROTIC FILMS OF PETER DE ROME are eight short movies blown up from super-8. Peter de Rome's movies are light years beyond the competition. The two best are based on sharp intuitions about the base fantasies of city sex life. DAYDREAMS FROM A CROSSTOWN BUS takes off from a face glimpsed in passing on a street—it captures something essential about New York eroticism. And UNDERGROUND actually presents the reality of a classic Fun City fantasy: cruising in a subway car, then sex on the moving train. They're audacious films. De Rome knows what excites—a sparkling combination of everyday street reality and the forbidden. It's the forbidden, the outrageous that really gets it off, especially done with de Rome's high spirits, his sense of fun. Humor doesn't hurt sex; it helps it. The performers are all attractive, but it is basically de Rome's sly, horny, poetic sensibility that makes these films a joy. If you see one sex movie, make sure it's THE EROTIC FILMS OF PETER DE ROME.

Dear Sir:

You may have already published a "Media Alert" on this subject but I thought it should be brought to your attention in case you haven't.

In the December issue of NGTF's Newsletter they mention a need for letters to be written to the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) in regards to BC Docket 78-237. The proposal is to benefit the Gay community. The proposal recommends that leaders of all significant community groups in a broadcast area (including leaders of the lesbian and Gay community) must be interviewed by local broadcasters to determine their needs and interests. The deadline is December 18, but the FCC will consider letters written after that date. This one proposal could help the Gay community to inform the public what the Gay lifestyle is really like.

I also noticed in the past in your "Media Alert" notices you ask people to monitor programs and write letters. I would like to bring to your attention that most people would write letters only if they are angry about something. If the program had shown Gay life in a negative manner and most would write letters if the program was positive toward Gay life. In the last case, can you imagine how many of Anita Bryant's people are writing letters at that time. That is the time positive letters should be written.

ED NOTE: AGN has reported on the FCC policy change in past issues. The NGTF advises that because of a petition by the Public Media Center, a San Francisco based non-profit, grass roots organization working for increased access to radio and TV for community-service and public-interest groups, the FCC is conducting an inquiry into the sources, scheduling and subjects of public-service announcements (PSAs). If your group has had experience trying to place PSAs - particularly on such "controversial" topics as Gay rights or feminist issues - your input is needed. Please write or call the Public Media Center, 2751 Hyde Street, San Francisco CA 94109; (415) 885-0200 for more information about what is at stake. When writing to the FCC, 1919 M Street, N.W., Washington, DC 20554, refer to Docket BC 78-251.

In addition, it is important to get the point across that letter writing is one of the most valuable tools the Gay community has. It is vital that everyone write to media sources when a presentation has been aired that is

negative to the Gay lifestyle. But it is just as important to write when a positive statement is made. Those fifteen cent letters are valuable ammunition. So keep those cards and letters going.

O'LEARY TO RESIGN AS CO-EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

OF NGTF IN JUNE

NEW YORK - Jean O'Leary has announced that she will resign as Co-Executive Director of the National Gay Task Force effective June 1979. Her decision to leave was made for personal reasons. Ms. O'Leary, who has established an outstanding record in this post since June 1976, first joined the NGTF staff as National Coordinator in 1975.

Kay Whitlock and Charles Brydon, Co-Chairs of the NGTF Board of Directors, expressed their appreciation to Ms. O'Leary for her distinguished service to NGTF and noted that "her enormous creative talent and energy will be greatly missed. We extend to her our best wishes for what we know will be successful future endeavors, and we look forward to a continued close association with her." Whitlock and Brydon emphasized that the Board expects to appoint a replacement for Dr. Bruce Voeller (whose resignation from the other Co-Director's position is effective January 1) well in advance of O'Leary's departure so that continuity will not be disturbed.

"We want to make it absolutely clear to NGTF's members and supporters around the country," they said, "that the replacements for both Jean O'Leary and Bruce Voeller will be found who are thoroughly familiar with the projects and plans of this organization, and that the change in NGTF's executive leadership will in no way interrupt the continuity of our goals and activities. Our organization has established itself as the major national organization in the field of Gay rights, and we are confident that changes in personnel will not affect our capacity to continue that leadership role and to do the jobs we've begun."

burdens of being a Gay Baptist adolescent. Of the children then, it was I, not the others, who needed protection. They were doing just fine; I was having the trouble.

The parallels to the growth of Nazi Germany get longer by the month. Hitler's first moves against the groups marked for extinction (Gays among the first) was to remove any favorable sympathy: Anita Bryant's stated goals for television is to prevent Gays from being presented in a sympathetic, favorable, or intelligent light. Hitler removed from those groups marked for extinction professional licenses: John Briggs, after refusing to vote to ban wearing Nazi uniforms in public, has, consistent with that position, authored Proposition 6. According to plan, those marked for extinction by Hitler were rounded up into concentration camps: Anita Bryant has already voiced her desire to have "camps" for Gays.

Yet the indolent, the lethargic, and the unconcerned would do well to keep in mind that it was not Hitler who conducted the Inquisitions, during which some of the most ingenious mechanisms for the torture of man were devised. It was not Hitler who conducted the Salem Witchhunts in this country. And it was not to protect this country from Hitler that our forefathers wrote the First Amendment in an attempt to insure that no religious group got its hands on the government and imposed its "beliefs" on the others. We would do well to remember that the very word "faggot" as applied to Gays is derived from the practice of placing Gays under the kindling (faggots) used for burning ecclesiastical offenders at the stake -- by the church.

VIEWPOINT

BOSTON - I have a friend who once said that the quickest way to pass the Equal Rights Amendment would be to send Ruth Carter Stapleton into Alton, Illinois and have her convert Phyllis Schlafly. But barring the possibility of a born-again feminist, she insisted that the women's movement desperately needed the services of a collector. I never did ask her what a collector was because it had all those unsavory Mafia undertones.

But on November 7, just a month after the passage of the ERA extension, I watched the election returns coming in from across the country. The ERA referenda lost, not only in Nevada where it was expected, but in Florida where some hoped it would squeak through. Despite some victories for pro-ERA candidates in state races (including, ironically, key ones in Florida), it looks as if it's going to be a cliff-hanger to get three more states by June 1982.

So I called my friend back to find out what a collector is supposed to collect. "Dues," she said abruptly, "Time, energy, money, work ... DUES! Somebody's got to get out there and find all the people who owe something to the women's rights movement and tell them that it's now or never, one more for the Gipper, dues-paying season..." Well never mind the cheerleading. I think my friend has a point. The women's movement has always been lousy at both taking the credit for accomplishments and holding onto the allegiance of the people who've profited from it. If George Meany behaved like that, he'd still be the head of a small local somewhere in the industrial northeast.

It's difficult for any movement as amorphous and massive as this one to stay together, and be coherent or consistent. Any group that is joined by discontent can be cast asunder by success or failure, confusion or exhaustion. The women's rights movement has suffered from all of the above. The core group has never found the proper glue to hold onto self-made women or to grasp the forgetful women. Nor have they been able to sign up all those who head for safety behind the line, "I'm Not a Feminist But..."

I'm not the only one who knows a "self-made" woman with a room near the top. She will talk about how hard she worked to get there, but not about how to make it any easier. She knows she wouldn't have been successful without a climate of acceptance, or the efforts of the women before her, some of whom got their spirits crushed trying to open the doors. We know the others too - all those who are Not Feminists But ... They believe in equal pay for equal work or Social Security for housewives or just plain fairness. When they get a new right they use it, but not without criticizing the people who won it, for being, well, "pushy."

It's not that easy to round up these debts for the last push. It's always more comfortable to think that we've made it or can make it all on our own. It's certainly more pleasant to think that the rights that women have already won can now be taken for granted. We all have amnesia. Few of us bow in the direction of Susan B. Anthony's home when we go to vote. But the job of a collector for the ERA is to "plug into" every woman who holds a job or benefits from a law she might not have had 10 years ago. To connect with every parent who wants or expects a better life for their daughters. It's to take the rest of us - the successful, the forgetful, the inactive - on a mental guilt trip, to poke our sense of responsibility and mutual self-interest.

It's a tough role, but the only legal antidote to a disastrous backslide. The only guarantee that we can take equal rights for granted ... three more states. Without taking up the collection of chits, anteing up the dues, these extra months can slip away as quickly as seven long years.
