

The scene was HisCo's parking lot, just outside the door. Friday night, November 3, somewhere around midnight. Four tired people, laden down with arm-loads of flyers approaching every person coming and going. It was uncomfortably cool outside. The door opened — people coming out — guys, girls, couples — sweating from their heavy dancing. They are approached.

"Have you gotten one of these?" A yellow flyer is thrust into their hands. Some take them gladly, some just take them. Some look and say yes, some say nothing and push past.

A tall, heavy woman comes out. "Have you gotten one of these?" She looks disgusted as she holds the flyer, and then throws it back at me; it flutters to the ground. I pick it up. "I don't want this," is her reply.

"You don't want it?" I question. "No," she says, "I'm not going to vote, I've never voted." "Never?" I ask.

"That's right. Say, why don't you guys forget this. We don't want it. I've never voted and I'm not going to now either." Such indignance!

"Why not," I ask. "Look," she snaps, "I'm just too busy to waste my time with this shit. Who cares anyway."

"You mean to tell me you don't care what happens, you're not interested in your own future?" I was beginning to think talking to her was a waste of my time.

"Listen, those politicians are all crooks and you're probably getting paid to do this. I don't care what they do, it isn't going to bother me, so just leave me alone."

One last try: "Well, if you're not going to vote, give it to one of your friends who will."

"My friends don't vote." She turned on her enormous heels and, with some sense of pride in what she had just said, she stomped off. "Cunt," I whispered under my breath...

I turned to face another coming out, a blond young man this time. "What's this?" he asked as he looked at the flyer now in his hands. I told him what it was.

"Oh, from CCR. Great. I've been wondering who to vote for. You guys are doing a great job. Thanks." He folded it up, put it in his pocket, smiled and walked away.

More people come out, I get the "not going to vote" routine again. Their lines were getting pretty tired, but we all had a job to do and we stayed.

600 flyers later, and somewhere around 3 a.m., seven of us sat swilling down coffee at Goog's comparing notes on our evening. We were all tired, but all felt that what we were doing was worthwhile. Encounters similar to my own came from everyone at the table. So much apathy, so much ignorance. But even so, over 4000 flyers went out that night alone.

I guess it's not so unusual, but it is unfortunate. We truly hope you will take the time to read this issue of *THE PRIDE*, paying special attention to the CCR Candidate Poll and the flyer page which follows it. We've already proven to ourselves and to other political organizations that we can make a difference.

And, after you've read, then go vote. I wish I could personally take every Gay person in Arizona to the Polls, but I can't. I can only hope that you'll care enough about yourself to go to the Polls on November 7 and cast your votes for your own future. Now, it's truly in your own hands, win or lose. Please care, please vote.



IT'S UP TO YOU!!

Well, Phoenix, you must know by now what time of year it is. All of you should, yet not all do. It is time for the 1978 General Election. "Who cares," you may be heard saying. You should, that's who. Afterall, we're voting on *your* rights!

In the Primary Election, held two months ago, slightly more than 50% of the registered voters of Maricopa County went to the polls to cast their votes. This may seem like a lot, but it really isn't. Only half of the people eligible to vote in this county, are, in fact, registered voters. *Only half!* And only half of these thought enough of it to make it to the polls to vote. If I were among these who haven't bothered, I'd be sorry. It is the right and responsibility of us all, feeble as it may seem, to be registered and to exercise this voting right we possess.

There are also many who support us, and it is these persons who deserve our support. We can, and should, voice our support for these people by voting for them.

I strongly urge you to read everything in this issue of *THE PRIDE*. The information in this issue will aid you in making intelligent decisions at the polls.

And then, get up off your chairs and vote!! Gays number approximately 100,000 in the Phoenix area. Each one should be at the polls on Tuesday, November 7, voting. If you don't, then you really don't have the right to call yourself "Gay", because you didn't care enough to support the Gay Community's needs as a body. One of those needs is to elect people who will help us fulfill our other needs and goals. And at this moment, that is the prime priority.

It's really up to you, it's really in your hands. And all you have to do is vote. Don't let yourself down, don't allow the wrong people to run our government — Vote! And be heard! It's up to you.

At the October 4 Louis Rhodes Fundraiser, held at the home of Mr. and Mrs. W. R. Schulz, Ron Atkins, CCR Lobbyist, in conversation with Bruce Babbitt, asked the Governor about California's Proposition 6 (Briggs). The Governor unequivocally stated that if such a bill were to cross his desk, he would most certainly veto it.

The Governor was also polled by Ron Atkins, using the questions listed on the 1978 Candidate Poll, found in the center of this magazine. The Governor's reply was yes to all three questions. On several occasions, Mr. Babbitt has extended his hand of friendship to various members of CCR's Steering Committee, and this publication is proud to endorse his candidacy. Voting for Bruce Babbitt is a must, in our opinion.

Other candidates viewed as favorable include Bill Perkins and Alan Flory, running for the Legislature in District 19; Rose Mofford, Secretary of State; Dino DeConcini, Attorney-General; Carolyn Warner, Superintendent of Public Instruction; and John Ahearn, Corporation Commission. 

THE QUESTIONS WE ASKED

The following is an explanation of the questions submitted to the candidates:

#1 Do you support decriminalization of private consenting adult sexual behavior.

Under current Arizona Law most persons are criminals. You don't believe it? Read!

See page 2

CCR played a major role in achieving the changes from the "old code" to the "new code". However, even though penalties are reduced, all sexual behavior, except that of married couples, is a crime. This should not be, and question #1 is aimed to show where the candidates stand on eliminating laws that define as crimes, private consenting acts.

#2 Do you support confirmation of the Equal Rights Amendment to the U.S. Constitution in 1979?

section 1. "Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or any state on account of sex."

section 2. "The Congress shall have the power to enforce by appropriate legislation, the provisions of this article."

section 3. "The amendment shall take effect two years after the date of ratification." (Complete text of the ERA)

If equality for women cannot be obtained, what hope is there for gays?

#3 Would you support legislation that would prohibit discrimination based on sexual or affectional preference?

This question is designed to get support for legislation that would outlaw discrimination in jobs and housing based on who you love or go to bed with.

HOW TO USE

THE POLL

The following steps can greatly expand the effectiveness of your interests in the 1978 General Election. We cannot overstate the importance of your immediate action.

1. Note your district. (see map)
2. Note candidates and party favorable to your cause.
3. Using your personal telephone directory, (do not assume that your friends know to vote) call everyone that you know. (This poll applies to hetero. and E.R.A. as well as Gay.) When you reach them:
 - A. Look up their district.
 - B. Explain favorable candidates.
 - C. Do not waste time with details. (unless asked) Simply tell them who to vote for in their district.
 - D. Tell them to write down the information.
 - E. Explain that is vitally important that they call everyone on their phone list (just as you are doing). This type of chain can reach every interested person in Arizona.
4. Repeat these three steps to all who will help...get them a copy of this poll, even if you have to take it to them. (Call CCR, we will help) Federal and State law guarantees you time to vote. Your employer must allow you time off to vote.

Remember, with one finger and your voice you can make this organization 10,000 times more effective. VOTE! Together, we can do it..

*Both the old and new criminal codes provide mandatory minimum prison terms without probation or parole if the crime is committed with a gun or deadly weapon.

SEXUAL ABUSE.

The crime called "sexual abuse" tags a maximum two-and-a-half year prison term on "a person" who approaches anyone else (other than wife or husband) with something called "sexual contact" — like pinching the waitress at the restaurant or sporting roamin' hands at the disco.

The problem is that the law provides an even tougher penalty for "a person" who does the same thing to a child under 15. The law does not punish only the "adult person" for "sexually contacting"

the child. It says "a person," which means any person — including another 14-year-old.

The legal definition of "sexual contact" includes something called "indirect fondling." How one fondles "indirectly" is a mystery, but conjectures range from petting to doing the "Bump" real close to suggesting same over the phone. Or, as House legal counsel Steve Twist wryly observes, "at the end of the proverbial 10-foot pole."

So Arizona now has a criminal penalty for two kids who are — knowingly and intentionally — necking.


KEN GRAVES.....

Briggs Coming!!




