




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
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THE PRIDE WELCOMES RAY LINCH

We spoke to Ray a few days ago, and he informs us that he has big plans — and good ones — for both bars. He said he intends to re-establish the Sportsman's as, "the bar you all grew up with" and we do look forward to this change. As for DL's, it will be closing, according to Ray, for a brief time for remodelling. The plans are to make DL's a piano bar, in addition to a show bar and to increase it's size. How well some of us remember the fine atmosphere DL's had some years back (7 or so) for meeting friends both old and new.

According to Robb Barton, who does the DJ thing at the Sportsman's, Ray is a really kind-hearted man with lots of good ideas. THE PRIDE welcomes Ray to our Valley, and wishes him well in his new venture.

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ANITA NOTES

Here are just a few of the many news items about our dear friend, one-time mediocre actress and would-be singing-star, ANITA BRYANT, who is unwittingly, in her anti-gay campaign, doing everything possible to unify the Gay Community in America.

HUNTINGTON, W.V: Anti-Gay Crusade leader Anita Bryant was subjected to cherry bomb explosions while doing her thing at Marshall University. Then on to Proctorville, Ohio, where she sang in church, and then announced that she was willing to give up her (so-called) singing career, if it was "God's will" that she continue her fight against gays. In response to a newsman's question when he asked if she was against civil rights for Gay people, Ms. Bryant said, "I am pro civil rights for parents and the straight majority. Homosexual rights are not denied as long as they don't flaunt their homosexuality and ask for special privileges."

MIAMI, FLA: A talent agency which handles Bryant stated that they will no longer handle her due to her up-coming book about her successful anti-Gay rights movement here. Dick Shack, of the Agency For The

Performing Arts, said, "It's not in keeping with her career or my professional standing." Bryant was not available for comment. Shack's wife is one of the Dade County Florida Commissioners who sponsored the pro-Gay ordinance when it was enacted in January.

HOUSTON, TX: While Anita sang, "My Little Corner of the World," more than 6000 Gays rallied outside a meeting of the Texas State Bar Association. More than 40 lawyers walked out when Bryant, hired as an entertainer for the June 16th convention, stepped up to the podium to sing. The attorneys wore black arm bands with an inverted pink triangle — the symbol of Nazi homosexual oppression. Houston police reported a crowd of 6000, but organizers of the protest rally stated that 8 — 10,000 persons actually attended. The throng marched 14 blocks from a local disco to the Hyatt House, scene of the convention, wore black arm bands and sang, "The Battle Hymn of the Republic" during the Bryant appearance.

HOLLYWOOD, CA: The list of Hollywood notables speaking out against Bryant is growing rapidly. Singer Jaye P. Morgan, Sally Struthers, Louise Fletcher, Shirley MacLaine, Ed Asner, Maureen Reagan, and Burt Lancaster, just to name a few. "It's baloney — Her campaign could turn into an old-fashioned witch hunt — We owe much of our music, dancing, costumes, plenty of everything to gays, their creative contributions to this business have been enormous —" are just a few of the comments, and this seems to be the rapidly increasing consensus of opinion.

SUN VALLEY, ID: Protestors shouted, "Go home, Anita. Leave Idaho alone!" Said Bryant, who was vacationing here, "They're trying to hurt my livelihood. No comment, please. My family's upset enough."

Isn't it just a crying pity that she's upset, after all she's done to destroy the lives of so many thousands of other people?

Keep it up, sweetheart! Remember, she who yells the loudest has the most to hide. Are you worried that someone might bring your son and husband out of their closets? (if they're not already out. . .) Wouldn't it be hell to be left all alone, just you and your mountains of self-generated hatred?

Or seek the truth of its own cause.


For doubt is what she can't allow

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
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
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DISCO SCENE

Hopefully this situation will improve shortly, but in the meantime, it would be wise to keep your eyes open when frequenting L.A. Hollywood bars.

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
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
