

Congressional Hearings Held

SAN FRANCISCO, CA - A first and important hurdle for the national Gay/Lesbian civil rights legislation has now been completed with the conclusion of the first Congressional Hearings on H.R. 2074, according to the Gay Rights National Lobby (GRNL). H.R. 2074 is the proposed national Gay Rights law. The hearings took place on October 10 in San Francisco before the Employment Opportunities Subcommittee of Education and Labor. The Subcommittee is chaired by Congressman Augustus Hawkins (D-CA). Other members of Congress present were Representatives Ted Weiss (one of the chief sponsors and a member of the Subcommittee), John Burton and Phil Burton (both from the San Francisco area). Minority Members of the Subcommittee were represented by the minority counsel, Jim Stephens.

The witnesses testifying included California
Assemblyman Art Agnos, Rev. Cecil Williams, Grant Mikens
(Executive Director of the Human Rights Commission of San
Francisco), Delores Huerta (First Vice President of the
United Farm Workers of America), Gwenn Craig (Vice President
of the Harvey Milk Gay Democratic Club), Ray Hartman (CoChair of the Gay Rights National Lobby), and Dr. Judd
Marmor (past President of the American Psychiatric Association). Steve Endean, Executive Director of GRNL, indicated
that the Lobby was coordinating additional written testimony from a number of major religious denominations as well.

Rev. Charles McIlhenny, who had faced a discrimination suit for firing his organist when he discovered that the organist was Gay (AGN, Feb. 1, 1980), testified against the legislation. McIlhenny contended that this legislation would discriminate against morality. However, in response to effective questioning by Representative Weiss, McIlhenny confessed that his view of morality could lead him to firing someone who had committed adultery or fornication as well. Ray Hartman, Co-Chair of the Board of Gay Rights National Lobby, a coed Members of the Subcommittee to re-examine the myth the support for Gay civil rights was politically damaging and specifically cited a recent poll by NBC/Associated Press showing that 49% favor extending fair housing and fair employment laws to Gays and that only 27% oppose

Although Congressman Weiss and the Gay Rights
National Lobby agreed that the Hearings marked a generally
positive beginning to a long process, there were some
minor reasons for concern. Even in San Francisco, the
Hearing Room was only about half full (and that included
a substantial number of opponents of the legislation) and
much of the non-Gay press virtually ignored the event. And
GRNL expressed concern that the questions of the Minority
Counsel, which were often far-fetched, too often diverted
the focus from the real issue of the legislation. Asked
what the next step would be for H.R. 2074, Endean said,
"After re-introduction of the bill next year, we expect
to have additional hearings next spring, probably in
Washington, DC."

NGTF Files Lawsuit

OKLAHOMA CITY, OK - The National Gay Task Force (NGTF) filed a lawsuit on October 14, in Oklahoma City Federal District Court challenging the constitutionality of a 1978 Oklahoma law that prohibits the employment of homosexuals or any person who advocates Gay rights by Oklahoma school systems. Known as the "Helms Bill," the law is similar to a statewide initiative in California (the Briggs initiative or Proposition 6) that was soundly defeated by California voters the same year.

"The Helms Bill is a patently discriminatory piece of legislation that singles out Lesbians and Gay men and any school employee association with us for harassment and abuse," commented NGTF Co-Director Lucia Valeska at a CONTINUED ON PAGE FOUR

FALWELL IN PHOENIX OCTOBER 28 PHOENIX - Jerry Falwell leader of Moral Majority will hold a Moral Majority rally at the State Capitol Building in Phoenix Tuesday, October 28. The rally will begin at 11:00 a.m. and continue until 12:30 p.m. Moral Majority is a national campaign attempting to politicize Christians into electing leaders who are willing to stand up against abortion, taxing church properties, sex education in schools, homosexuality, Equal Rights Amendment, etc.

Gay-Cos (Gay Christian Out-Reach Services) will hold a very simple, quiet, Christian protest at the rally. Rev. Fred Pattison, Casa de Cristo MCC, has prepared a folder entitled "Welcome to Phoenix -Jerry," which will be distributed prior to the rally. Volunteers will meet at Casa de Cristo, 1029 E. Turney, at 9:30 a.m. for last minute instructions.

GOLDWATER: ANTI-ABORTION ANTI-ERA ANTI-HOMOSEXUALITY

TUCSON - Sen. Barry Goldwater told a church group here last Monday that he supports a constitutional amendment to ban abortions, although his office has been saying otherwise to those who feel a woman should be able to make her own choice. "I have always felt that we should try to introduce a life amendment," Goldwater said in response to a question from choice advocate Greer Barkley. The senator said he doubts that Congress will pass the amendment because of its tendency to favor federally funded abortions, but added, "If it takes a constitutional amendment - it's a major step - then I'm going to go that way.'

On other matters, Goldwater told the group he opposes the proposed Equal Rights Amendment, thinks creation should be taught in schools "without reference to any denomination," and sees homosexuality as a "perversion of normal and moral behavior," although he would not deny anyone's right to be homosexual.

GAY IS OK IN SCOTLAND

LONDON, ENGLAND (GayLife) - Homosexual acts are now legal in Scotland. In a surprise move, the British House of Commons voted 203 to 80 to add to the Scottish Criminal Justice Bill, an amendment permitting homosexual acts between consenting adults in Scotland. The free vote, lead by Robin Cook, Labour MP for Edinburgh Central, brings Scottish laws on homosexuality in line with those of England and Wales. It is understood that the government will not oppose the amendment when the bill boes to the house of Lords.

KKK IS PROUD OF ANTI-GAY VIOLENCE FONTANA, CA (GayLife) - Southern California Klu Klux Klan members bragged at a press conference that they "know how to take care of perverts." The three men, who are supporters of KKK candidate for Congress, Tom Metzger, told a crowd at a Klan rally outside of Fontana, California, that they had "ran across three fags" by "accident" and that when they had "finished with the two faggots" that they "won't be good for anybody's use." They told how they had beat up two homosexual men in their early twenties who had propositioned them at a roadside rest room, and that they tied the two "fags" up and then stuck "tire irons we heated with a blow torch up their asses." The Klan members said that this is "the way real men deal with these disgusting creatures of satan."

YOU DON'T HAVE TO BE HONEST TO BE IN POLITICS

LOS ANGELES, CA (GayLife) - Ronald Reagan is actually signing a bill to liberalize abortion in a piece of film being used in one of his commercials, although the announcer describes the legislation as a tax cut bill. A former legislator - U.S. Rep. Anthony Beilenson, a Federal Gay rights bill co-sponsor who is also in the ad has pointed out the discrepancy. Reagan signed the abortion bill in 1967 and has since said he regrets signing it. Reagan's press secretary, Lyn Nofziger, has not announced any decision about the future use of the commercial, which has been running nationally since September 10.



news conference in Oklahoma City. "It is an attack on every school employee's fundamental livelihood, especially those who are Gay, and we cannot allow this law to remain unchallenged." "The law punishes the constitutionally protected right to free speech, assembly and association, noted Stephen Parrish, of Gay Rights Advocates (GRA). "It creates a severe chilling effect that inhibits teachers and other employees from participating in organizations or political campaigns in which Gay rights is an issue. This is clearly a violation of Constitutional rights and must be struck down by the courts."

William B. Rogers of Oklahoma City who is serving as local cooperating attorney for the action noted the whichever side loses, the decision will be appealed. My clients are prepared to see this fight through to the U.S. Supreme Court if necessary. That any U.S. citizen is denied the right to teach or practice any profession or hold any job because of sexual orientation is intolerable. I do not believe the Supreme Court would sustain such an invasion of privacy or curtailment of free speech and assembly."





DOUBLE STANDARDS FOR LESBIAN

LOS ANGELES, CA (GayLife) - A recent paper by a psychology student appears to support the view that a patient's perceived sexual orientation can radically alter the way he or she is treated by a psychologist. Terri Levi, a student at the California School of Professional Psychology, recently completed a study with 106 practicing clinical psychology interns.

The interns were divided into two groups, and each group viewed a 20 minute video tape of a therapy session. Both groups were told that the women in the videotape had sought therapy because she had just ended a relationship. However, one group was told that the woman had just broken up with a man while the other half was told she had just broken up with a woman and had identified herself as a Lesbian.

Interns who thought the client was heterosexual, four her "way above normal," and said they were impressed with the way the client (as a heterosexual) handled the stress of breaking up. Interns who were told the client was a Lesbian, however, gave her an overwhelming negative rating and saw her as having a significant low personal adjustment, negative personality characteristics and poor self-control.

There was a fantastic birthday party over at the


