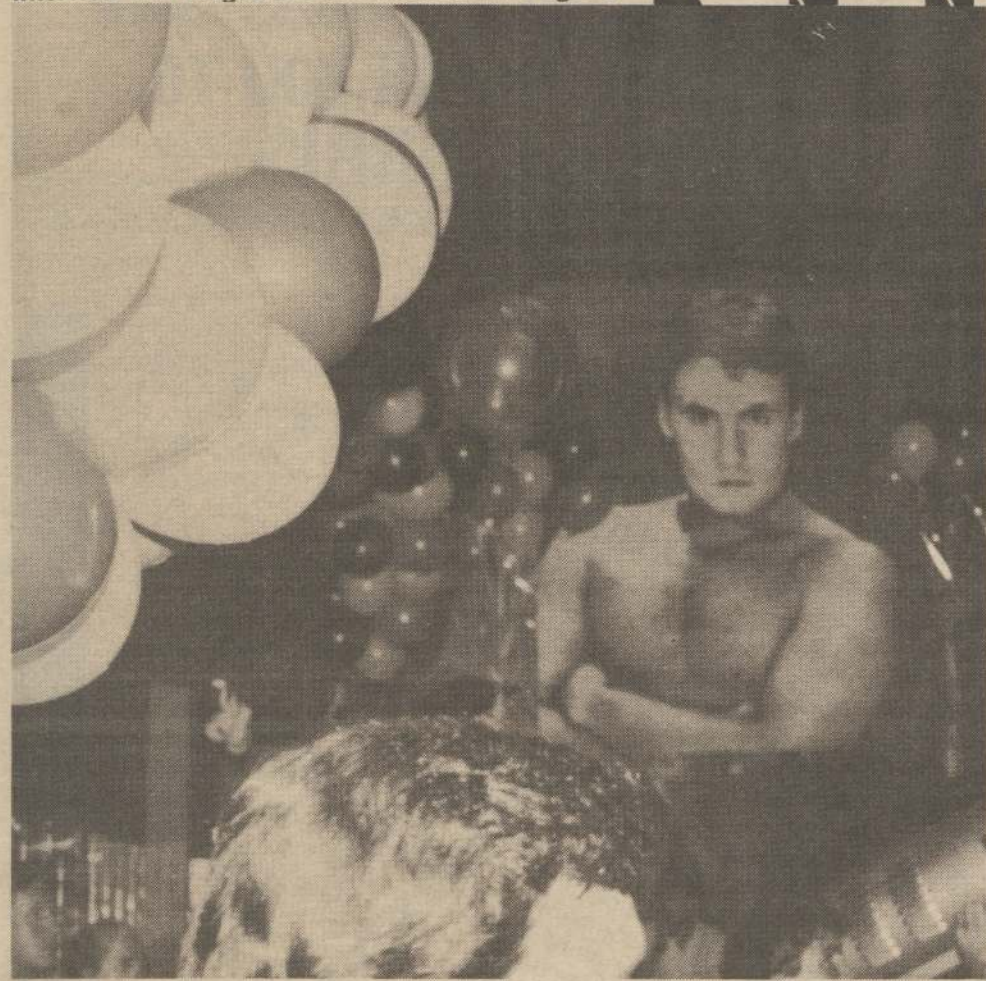

We have rejected only those articles we found to be presentations of hostility; constructive criticism of our work is appreciated and that of others' work is passed directly to the source, where it is most apt to do the most good. This paper is not for us, it is for you and we have attempted to give an accurate depiction of life in Phoenix. It is part of human nature that the author of a given subject will interject a bit of himself for we all have different interpretations of same given subject. The majority of PR is compiled by the two of us and we do put a lot of ourselves into it, however, there are times we bite the bullet and print subject contrary to personal belief, for opinion is a part of ourselves we have avoided insertion of other than adhering to our original presentation of format, one we hoped would produce a lighthearted resource to promote community interaction.

Let's go back to that word: OPINION. We are on the receiving end of a great deal of it. Happily, we most often get a part on the back and enough encouragement to continue on our course. A community newspaper is not exactly a glamour job nor is it a "get rich quick scheme." It is a giant leap into the backstage reality of our world and we've developed a new appreciation for the talents of the people who create the events arranged for community entertainment which often double as fundraising activities. Before digressing further, we'll backtrack to OPINION. Not all opinion received by PR is positive, recently, more so than in the past, there have been strong feelings expressed that we dwell far too much on one particular aspect of our lifestyle... that of female impersonation. We're not meaning to blow this out of proportion, Phoenix as a whole either enjoys the theatre of drag or views it as not for them but gives it the important "live and let live" attitude. However, in the impossible quest to please everyone, we feel compelled to give our OPINION. The intent of this rebuttal is not for the sake of argument, but rather share a viewpoint that is new for us. First and foremost, we homosexuals are already a minority; he among us who has not experienced some form of persecution for "social deviance" is the exception to the rule. We, the people of same sex sexual preference span all walks of life, racially, religiously, financially, right down to what we choose to do behind closed doors. We do hold one common ground, a very strong one... we are still considered abnormal by the majority of Spaceship Earth's people. How does one find logic in considering his/her social deviance to be more acceptable than another's?

What narrow-mindedness it takes to pass up one of Phoenix' few opportunities to keep abreast of our community for lack of ability to pass over articles not suited to one's particular taste.

Perhaps we've come on a little strong here for an editorial designed to reach a small percentage of our readership. It is not a comfortable situation to be put on the defense and we find it best to resolve such sensation.

We planned on a quick note covering the above with intention of expressing our delight in participation of "Get Physical" and acknowledge the persons responsible for the tremendous success of the event. Thank You for bringing Phoenix a Celebration of Life while promoting a cause undertaking a responsibility and commitment to those afflicted with the virus that is stealing the lives of young people as well as stealing away advancements achieved in the heyday of Gay Lib.

This is no time to bicker among ourselves. If we are to maintain strength as the subculture that we are, it can only be done in unity. As for our earlier tangent, this is your paper, too. If you're not finding all you seek within it, get out your pencil and paper and spell it out. Yes, Folks, you, too, can be a journalist!

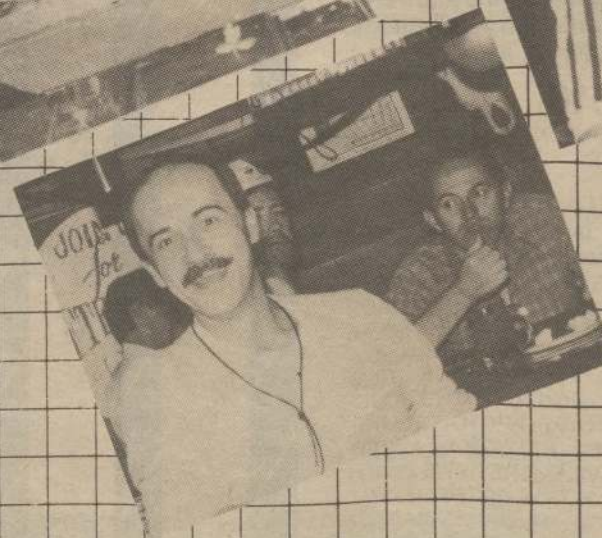
ORSINI'S WITH CASA DE CRISTO (MCC) HELP BOOST AAF

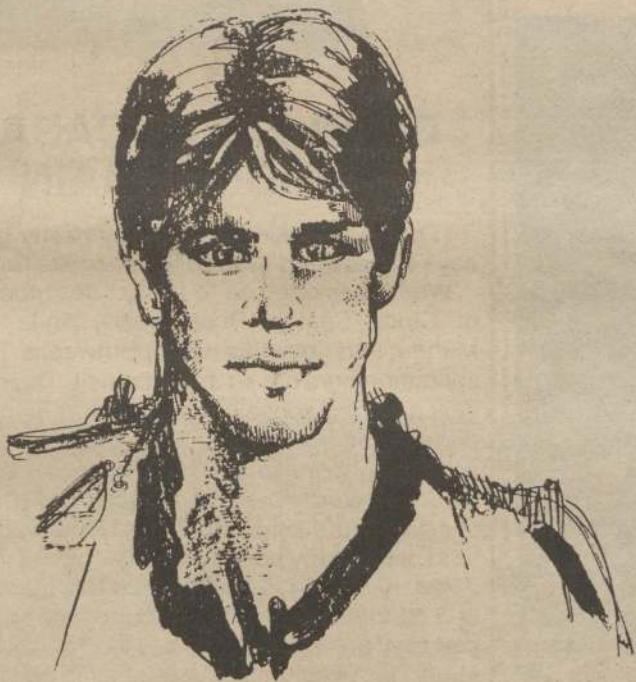
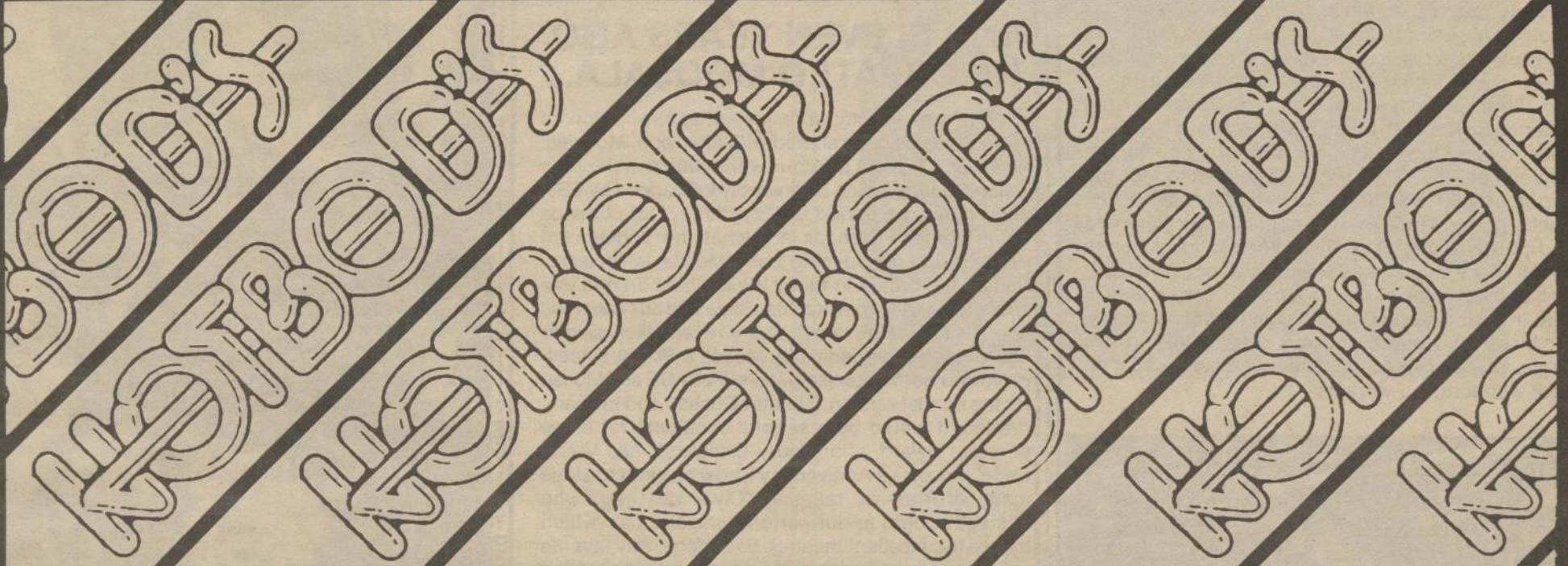

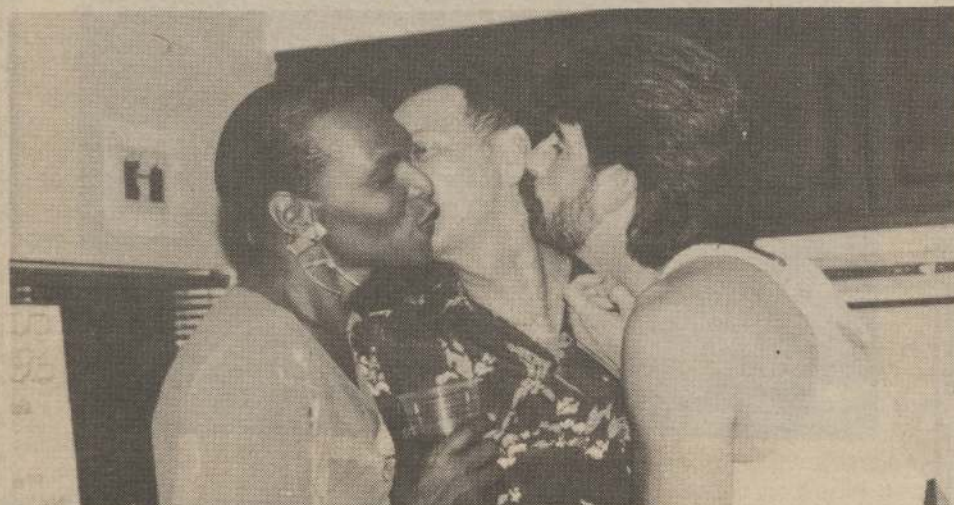
MAGDA DIONI

The first thing that people think when they hear the name Magda Dioni is "what is that." Not a what, but a who. Being an avid dance music follower I knew who and what she was. But I soon found out that I was in a small group of people. The hotel in which she stayed asked for the spelling three times and the receptionist at the front desk thought I was joking when I asked for her room. Well, Magda Dioni is the name, previously Magda Layna in 1983, when she had a hit in the high energy clubs with a remake of "When Will I See You Again." Her newest release was delayed because of the title, "Dangerous," which just so happens to match two other dance songs out now, but is not a copy of either.

My biggest fear upon meeting Magda and her friends at the airport was whether or not she would give "star attitude." I knew that I had had little sleep and would not have dealt well with this. But I was instantly relieved when a somewhat shy, striking woman introduced herself to me, along with her manager, Gary Noguera. Along with Magda were her friends Marty and Nina, Gary's mom. Having ones' mom along made it somewhat more personable and real.

Magda ran through her soundcheck smoothly and professionally, not even bothered by a half hour delay in equipment problems. She arrived at the reception on time and made it a point to greet everyone there.



At 2 AM, showtime at the "Get Physical 85" benefit I was just about exhausted, but back stage Magda was ready to go. We snuck her onstage and quietly concealed her behind Hotbods huge video screen. As the first beats of "One Night Only" came through the sound system and the video flashed her name, the screen came up and out came MAGDA DIONI. Her name was spelled out so that no one would have further problems with it.

This interview was done over the phone as I and Magda rested in our homes, recovering from the weekend.

CSC: First, I want to thank you for going out of your way to come to Phoenix at no charge to us and joining us for the benefit.

MD: Oh, you're welcome. I had a great time.

CSC: What was your reaction to Phoenix? Have you ever been here?

MD: No, never before. My first reaction was HOT! God, it was hot. I was listening to my walkman on the plane so I didn't hear the pilot telling us the temperature, so when I walked off the plane and that heat hit me in the face I couldn't believe it. In San Francisco it is much cooler.

CSC: You were here for the end. You should have been here all summer.

MD: I was impressed with the greenery of the state.

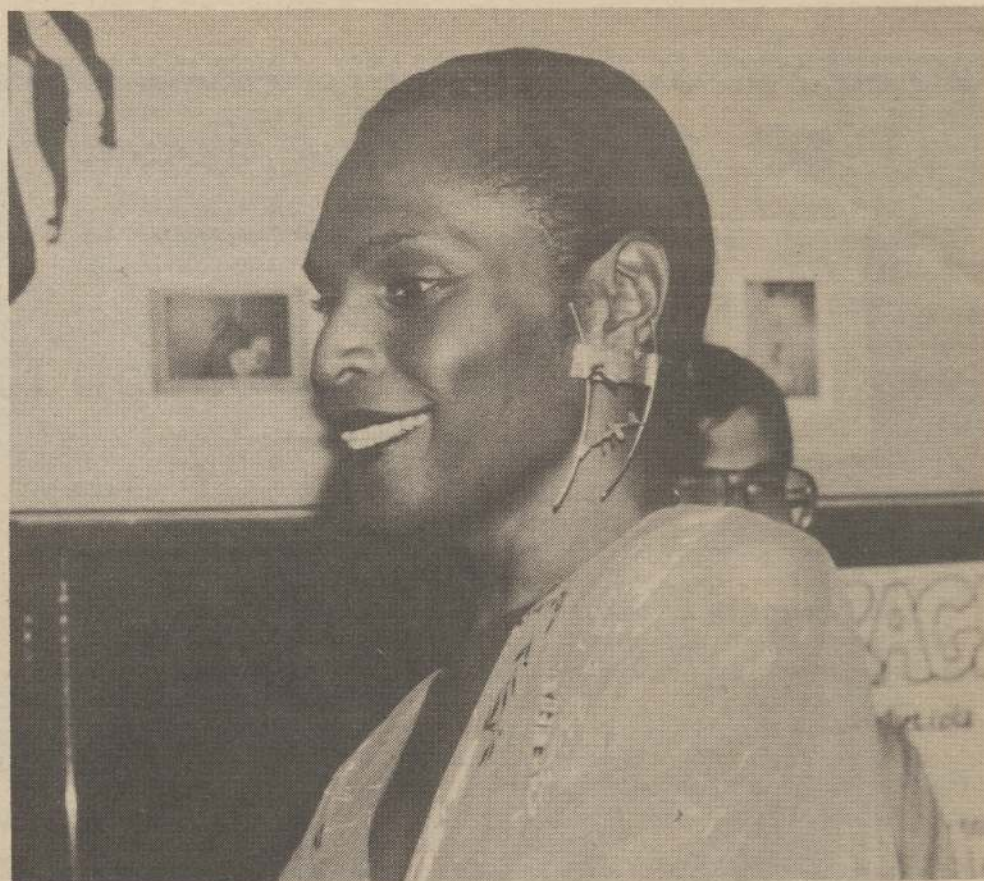
CSC: Green?! Where were you looking.

MD: Well, from my window at the hotel it all looked so green. In San Francisco we have concrete lawns.

CSC: Next time we'll have to take you out to the desert. Ain't no green there.

MD: I really like Phoenix. It was friendly. And green.

CSC: Is it easy for you to get on stage? Do you find yourself backstage saying, "God, I don't want to go out there.?"



MD: No, never. I love performing. I love the stage and the energy. I worry that the audience won't like me, but then I get so into my music I just forget it and sing. I just go out and do my thing.

CSC: Have you ever had a bad audience?

MD: No, not an audience. But I had a bad sound system once. It was terrible. I couldn't get into the music. Which made the show bad.

CSC: Too many performers are afraid to join the crowd, but you jumped right down there and partied with them. It made you very special to some people. Were you always comfortable in joining the crowd?

MD: Oooh, yes. I love people. People make you what you are. I love getting down with them and mixing and letting them know I am real. I've never been afraid. And I hope I never will be. Some people become so big that they can't do that anymore. I hope that doesn't happen to me.

CSC: We recently had Sylvester Himself here and she just read the audience to filth. How do you feel about "star attitude?"

MD: I don't like it and I don't have any. I like treating people like people. We're all the same.

CSC: What took you so long between "When Will I See You Again" and "Dangerous?"

MD: We were looking for a good song. I wanted a good high energy song. Gary and I shopped around for a while. I love high energy music.

CSC: Why did you change the name from Layna to Dioni?

MD: Well, legal problems. When I started I just wanted to use Magda, but my producer wanted a second name and came up with Layna. When I broke away from him I didn't want any legal complications so I used Dioni.

CSC: Have you encountered attitude within the business?

MD: Oh yes. Much. The producers give you such attitude. And some club owners and D.J.'s. Too many divas!

CSC: Has the recording business been easy for you?

MD: Yes and no. It's easy for me to do, but in the beginning I had some problem with my voice. All the high energy songs were sung by screaming divas and I have a very low register so it took me a long time to become comfortable with my voice.

CSC: Are you now?

MD: Yes.

CSC: Good, because I like it this way. It has character. Are you influenced by other performers?

MD: Yes, I love Patti LaBelle. She's great. And I like Sylvesters music. It has so much energy.

CSC: Sylvester has great writers. His music is well produced but his performances need work. Where else have you performed?

MD: The Troc in San Francisco and Studio 54.

CSC: What was your favorite place so far?

MD: Well, this will sound corny but I really like Phoenix. I was so warned about the crowds there, that they were reserved, but when I came on they were screaming and blowing whistles. I loved the stage too. So many times dance clubs have small postage stamp stages and that leaves no room to work. The Phoenix audience was really warm, and receptive. I felt appreciated.

CSC: I'm so glad. With AIDS taking away so much of the dance clubs business do you feel threatened that it will all be gone tomorrow?

MD: No, there are so many avenues to go to. I love high energy, but I would also like to do some jazz. This may sound terrible, but I would love to do a lounge act. Something in Las Vegas, with torch songs and costumes. (She laughs.) You know, lots of stuff.

CSC: Yes, every girls dream. What is coming up for Magda Dioni?

MD: Well, I have a couple of projects. One is a small part in a movie where I am a singer in a night club. It's a small small part, but I get my name up there. It's being filmed in San Francisco.

CSC: That's great. What about music?

MD: I have a new song coming soon, but I can't say what it is.

CSC: Anything you want to add?

MD: Just thank you for a great time and thank you to those who have faith in me and who like me. It's important to me.

HUMANSPACE BOOK REVIEW

Another Mother Tongue: Gay Words, Gay Worlds. Judy Grahn, author. Boston, MA: Beacon Press, 1984. 284 pages, bibliography, index. \$19.95 hard-bound; \$9.95 paperbound.

Beacon Press underestimated the magnitude of interest in "Another Mother Tongue." Their first printing sold out in six weeks, and then it took the urging of their distributors and booksellers to get them back to press. Interest has remained high, and five months later, "Another Mother Tongue" is available in some book stores. Beacon Press books are published under the auspices of the Unitarian Universalist Association of Congregations in North America, and distributed through a mainstream publisher (Harper and Row). I, personally, applaud the hard work and good spirit of everyone involved in getting this book into my hands.

Judy Grahn is now in her mid-forties. When she was eighteen, her first lover taught her the language, verbal and nonverbal, of gay identity. Neither of them knew the roots of this other language, or the origins of the universally recognized codes, customs and components of their gay lifestyle. "Another Mother Tongue" is a product of many years of Grahn's curiosity and research, and of her continuing friendship with her first lover.

The presentation of Grahn's research findings and conclusions is interspersed with brief passages of remarks to her first lover. Some readers have found these interjections annoying; I didn't. I found the incidents described appropriate illustrations of the strength and resourcefulness of the men and women whose history is presented in the text.

Why "gay"? Why lavender? Why "fairy" or "dyke"? Why pinky rings? What was the significance of homosexuality, and what were the special roles assigned to gay people... in mythology, in spirituality, in the histories of other lands, in the history of native Americans? Whenever possible, Grahn presents documented information. When she runs out of primary and secondary source materials, she combines her knowledge and her experience to present conjectures that link and affirm the positive implications of history.

This book has been needed for years, to expand the scope of other groundbreaking books such as "Gayspeak" and "Gay American History." It will remain a source of reference and pleasure.

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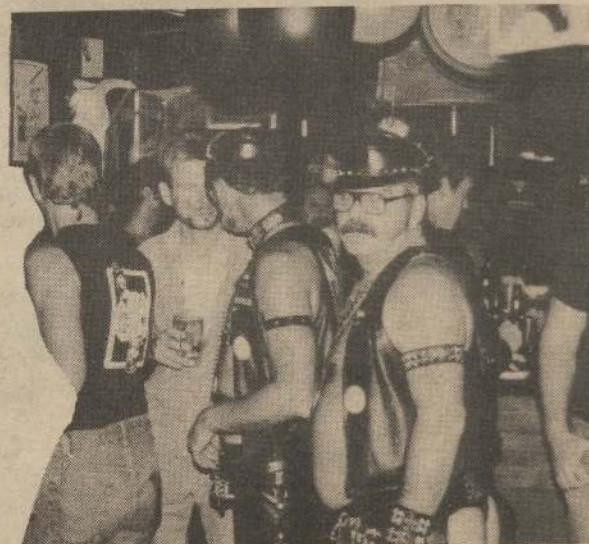


FRIDAY THE 13th... BLACK SABBATH... RAMROD...

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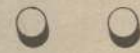

JANUS THEATRE'S GEMINI

There are, it seems, two types of plays. There are Great Big showy Plays, with lots of laughs (or lots of tears), stunning finales, and (in the case of a musical) stupendous production numbers. Then too, there are also Nice Little Plays, offering occasional snickers (or a lump in the throat) and very little to say for themselves.

Great Big Showy Plays are a breeze to witness, while Nice Little Plays are nearly impossible to review. In critiquing a Nice Little Play, a reviewer must take into consideration a number of things. Perhaps, for example, the play meant to be Great Big and Showy, and ended up coming across as merely Nice and Little. Why did the playhouse choose to present the play? Did the script offer more humour (or dramatics) than the cast delivered?

Alberto Innaurato's *Gemini* is a Nice Little Play. As presented by Janus Theatre, this Nice Little Play offered less than the assembled cast presented in the way of a number of fine performances.

Innaurato's story concerns a group of lower middle class persons and their varying reactions to

homosexuality. Fran Geminiani, the central character, is a twenty-year-old man preparing to "come out of the closet." As he struggles to understand his sexual self, he seeks advice and understanding from his family, his friends, and his neighbors. On his twenty-first birthday ("celebrated" in Act II), he receives cake, presents, a gross ton of rather warped advice... and absolutely **no** understanding.

While *Gemini* offers frequent laughs and humorous characters, there is nothing terribly funny about its homophobic nature. For all of Francis' determined rantings and ravings about his new found sexuality, he does not manage to enlighten any of the play's other characters toward an understanding that "Gay is okay." At the play's finish, Francis has left his father and neighbors with their confused and confusing attitudes about homosexuality. And while his father does offer up a half-hearted "I think he's going to be alright," the unspoken conclusion to this sentence seems to be an "even though he's gay." Furthermore, Innaurato offers no motivation for Francis' leaving for Boston with two of the play's most homophobic characters at play's end.

The play's uneven storyline, unexplained ending, and homophobic theme apparently went unnoticed by the play's cast (some of whom are gay themselves), most of whom turned in well-rounded, enjoyable performances.

Mark Fleming, as Francis, is convincing in his role as the confused young man, confronting his homosexuality on the eve of his twentieth birthday. Especially humorous (and painful, as well) is Fleming's tantrum scene, where he as Francis vehemently "thanks" each of the cast members for creating/supporting his confused existence. Fleming manages to keep Francis from appearing too tragic a figure with his bitingly sarcastic performance.

Sandy Rothberg is uproarious as the slutty Bunny ("I have hepatitis hair!"), clowning her way through what amounts to a very funny performance. Though her drunken monologue in Act II is a bit over-long, she rescues what could have been a rather maudlin suicide scene in a bit of business with her nightgown.

David Perler, as Francis's best friend/love interest, is a bit too good to be true. All perfect smile and fine physique. Perler's character is the kind of boy we all loved to hate in high school. Perler's is the most relaxed, un-selfconscious performance, leading one



to wonder just how much of himself he brought to the role.

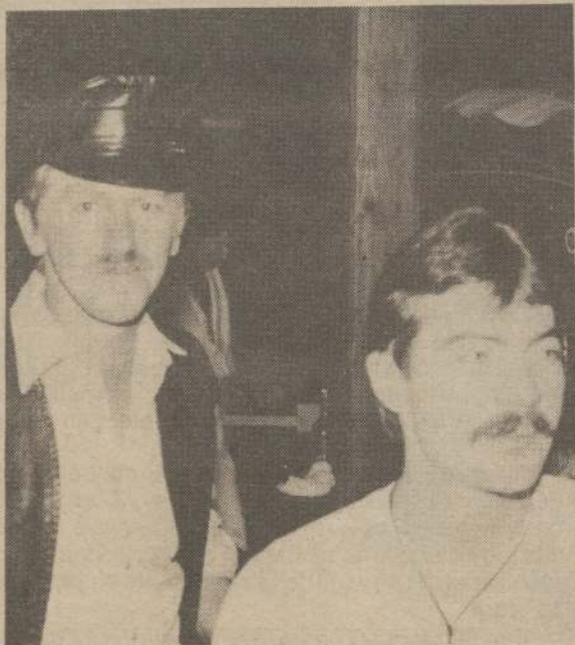
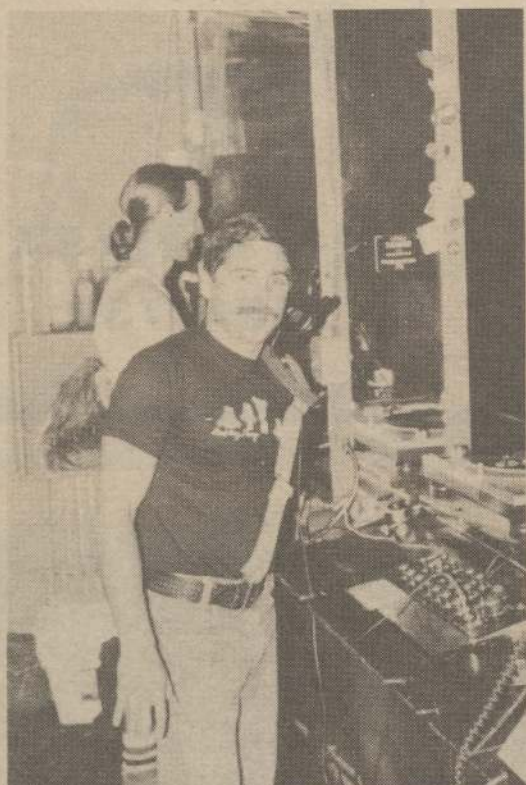
And, while this reviewer did not initially enjoy Ellen Rettberg's performance as Lucille Pompei, I must admit to having carried away pleasant thoughts about this strikingly attractive woman who managed to steal a pair of scenes with admirable restraint and some very vulgar Italian phrases.

The remaining cast members fared better than their rather bland costuming (Jeffrey Middleton had me convinced, several times, that he was a creepy little boy), and it is to their credit that they did not once trip over any of the plastic plants strewn about the stage.

All in all, Janus Theatre's production of *Gemini* is pleasant enough, turning out agreeable performances by its actors in a play with very little to say for itself.

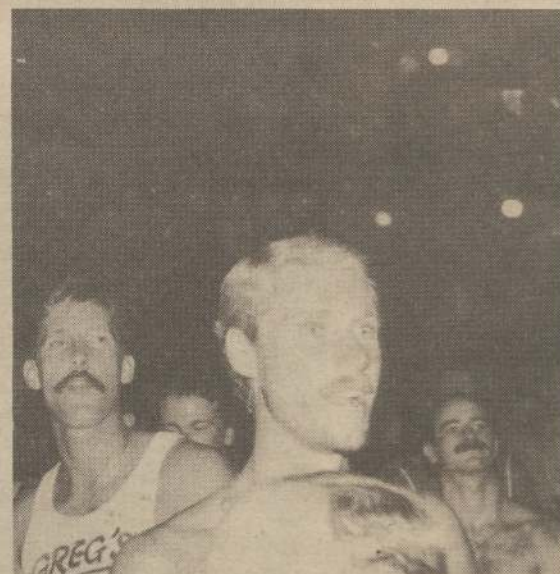
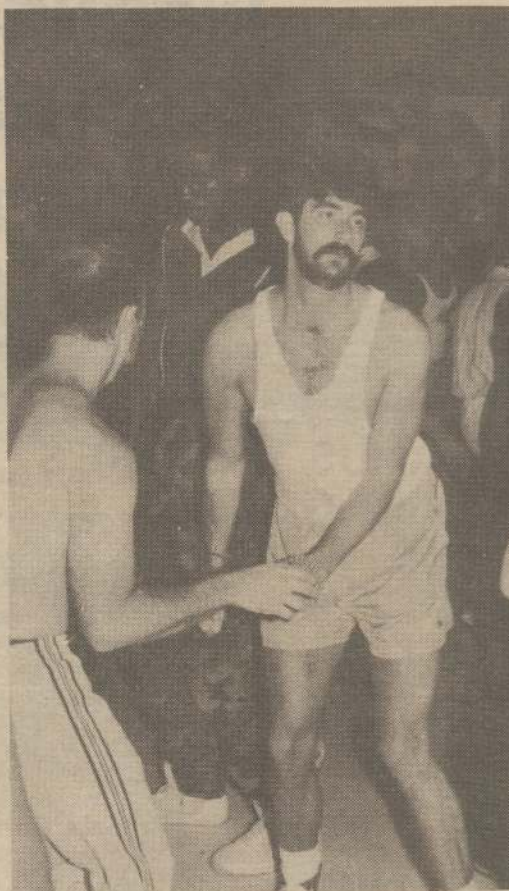


GET PHYSICAL... SERIOUS CAUSE, SERIOUS PARTY

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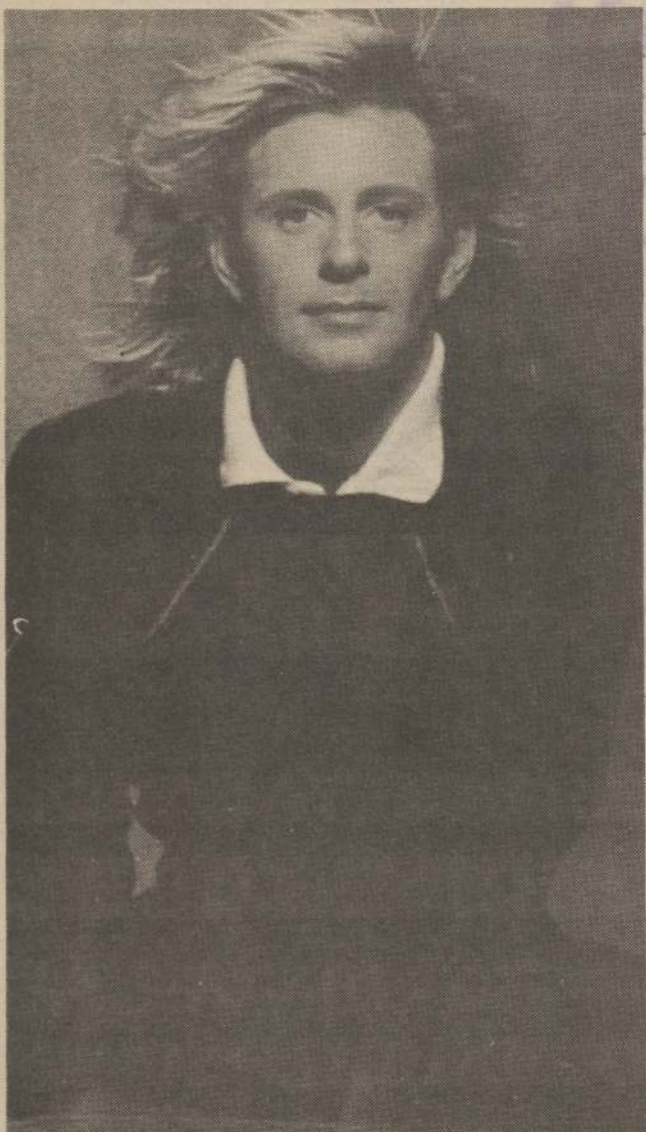
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HOME OF THE ARIZONA RANGERS

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BILLY CRYSTAL
YOU LOOK MARVELOUS
 (A&M; Produced by Bob Tischler)



While the title cut from Billy Crystal's debut album has provided us with this year's giddiest novelty song, as well as everybody's favorite all-purpose catch line, all is not so **mahvelous** in album land.

Listening to this LP, one gets the feeling that one must first be familiar with Crystal's characters and on-stage personae (much of the album is recorded live at the Bottom Line) before feeling at home in his vinyl bag-of-tricks.

Although Crystal employs all of the tried-and-true comedic motifs (New York, Jews, Fags, Puberty), he

too frequently segues into unintroduced characterizations which leave the listener cold.

Because it sports a musical track, "I Hate When That Happens" is the "other song" here. Mainly a masochistic monologue between Crystal and guest Christopher Guest, the track derives little humour from a pretty senseless, highly unfunny exchange between the two comedians.

It is to Crystal's credit that he manages to keep his on-record audience yucking it up with occasional allusion to his Fernando character. When things get dull, when the audience fails to snicker their approval, Crystal interjects a trademark "you look maaaaah-velous!" and the audience roars.

In fact, Crystal reprises Fernando (unfortunately without Arthur Baker's sicoid assistance and for a mere twenty-one seconds) on the album's closing cut, "Fernando's Special Gift." But to no avail. Fernando's gift is not special enough to save this rather routine stand-up effort. If the listener has made it this far into the album, he will have explained for himself the back cover photo, showing our Billy seated in an empty theatre audience, yawning widely.

Caveat emptor.

SCRITTI POLITTI
CUPID AND PSYCHE '85

(Warner Brothers; Produced by Arif Mardin)



In the years between Scritti's 1978 debut, "Skank Bloc Bologna" and this current offering, singer/songwriter Green Strohmeier-Gartside has transformed Scritti's raw punk into a glossy, surrealistic muzak aimed at pop radio and palpable sales figures.

This, it seems, is what happens when Punk grows up. Homogeny and dance beats. Hit singles and clever lyrics. Ballads and boredom.

Cupid and Psyche is a nice album, though not a very thoughtful one. It is enjoyable as far as it is taken, on into the depths of Arif Mardin's plush arrangements and no further.

Green's lilting vocals caress his neatly abstract word games, and perhaps the most enjoyable aspect of this recording is its indecipherable imagery. Just what is our man singing about?

"Wood Beez (Sing Like Aretha Franklin)" nicely summarizes the album's content. A club hit from '84, "Wood Beez" matches Green's cool vocal and psychotic allusion with blasts of Arthur Baker-style percussion.

Because much of the rest of **Cupid and Psyche** repeats the formula of "Wood Beez," it is both a pleasant outing and as well as a superfluous one. Skip the album and buy the 12" single.

Daryl Hall has soul. He has, in the past few years, done everything in his ample musical powers to prove this.

Okay, Daryl. We believe you now. Performing at the

Apollo really has us convinced. Singing alongside the likes of David Ruffin and Eddie Kendrick - you must be doing something right.

And, if there was any remaining doubt in our minds, RCA brings us "Live at the Apollo," a LP featuring live versions of your **blackest** blue-eyed numbers.

But really, we get the point. This isn't so much a live Hall and Oates album as it is a tangible testimony to just how very black you guys really are. Why else would you choose to include the lamest of your hits here... those songs which show off your doo-wop skills to greatest advantage?

Leathernotes

Well, summer is slowly starting to pass us by. Moving into fall at the usually casual rate of Phoenix seasons gives you plenty of time to get your leather attire ready for heavier winter use. For many recently, though, fall and winter have been too slow in coming. Judging by all the leather being worn the last couple of weeks around town (especially Larry's Ramrod) the men of Phoenix have decided now is as good as ever and with its usual effect, leather has definitely added to the general atmosphere.

So, come on. Pull that stuff out of the drawer, open up that closet and lets get going guys. For those who are a little more adventuresome and have been wearing their leather on and off during the summer months it won't be so hard to find. For the rest of you, well, it is in there somewhere. Let's get it out and get it ready. For minor repair and alteration bring it on down to Tuff Stuff and we'll get you fixed up. For heavy cleaning you might try Swan Cleaners on 32nd Street or Leather and Suede Cleaners on 18th Street and Indian School. For most though a simple and complete oil job will be all that is needed. Leather should be oiled well and often with either mink or neetsfoot oils. Quick penetrating, they soften and enhance the texture of the leather. Applied with a little elbow grease and a clean cloth the oil will also loosen surface dirt and remove it. For older leathers sometimes a wax or leather polish can be used to bring back the sheen of newer leathers. We really don't like the use of waxes as they decrease the life of the leather. But they do have a short lived purpose. For minor stretching under the arms of vests, in the seat and knees of pants and chaps, wet the suede side of the stretched area and allow to dry or iron on a medium setting until dry. As the leather dries it will contract some. Of course, if they have become baggy or have lost a good deal of their shape then bring them in to us and let's see if they can be reworked. (One nice thing about freshly oiled leather though, is it has a tendency to overcome the perfumes floating around the bar.)

Once you have your current wardrobe together and ready to go, the next step may be to add that important piece you've been thinking of all summer. Or maybe a recent trip to L.A., San Francisco or Denver gave you all kinds of new ideas. If so, now is the time to move on it. Right now we at Tuff Stuff are working on a four to six week waiting list and we will soon be moving up to six week to eight. Come on in now for anything you plan to wear before Christmas.

If you or your boy has failed to maintain your boots during the summer and a good cleaning and polish hasn't done it, you can find excellent repair work at Rudy's Shoe Repair on Oak and 32nd Streets. If they need to be replaced all together you can find boots from \$39.25 at Payless Shoes on up to \$150 at Red Wing Shoes located in many malls around town.

Maybe a jacket is on your list. At Tuff Stuff we carry four different styles in two different weights. Our two heavier jackets are Hein Gerrick and are motorcycle type jackets. The two lighter weights are Golden State leathers and are a little more dressy. Other places to check on jackets are Martin Uniform Company and, for custom made jackets, (which we don't do), try Lancer Leather. Be careful purchasing a jacket though. Many times a \$20.00 savings is no saving at all. Don't buy it if the leather feels like cardboard (Shott Brothers) or if the different panels of the jacket seem to have been made from several different cows (Perfecto). If nylon stitching is available buy it over cotton thread. It will double the life of your jacket or any leather piece for that matter.

It is time men. Let's get it together and pick up to pace a bit. As the weather cools and more and more leather shows up around town let's remember one major point of leather, brotherhood. It is the feeling of friendship and comradery that leather gives men of similar points of view that is more important than the particular cut of their vests or harnesses. As men, we are of vital importance to both ourselves and our community. Let's be more visable and active. God knows there has to be an alternative to some of the things that have passed as entertainment in the gay community lately. Come on guys, let's do it now.

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
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TREAT OR TRICK?

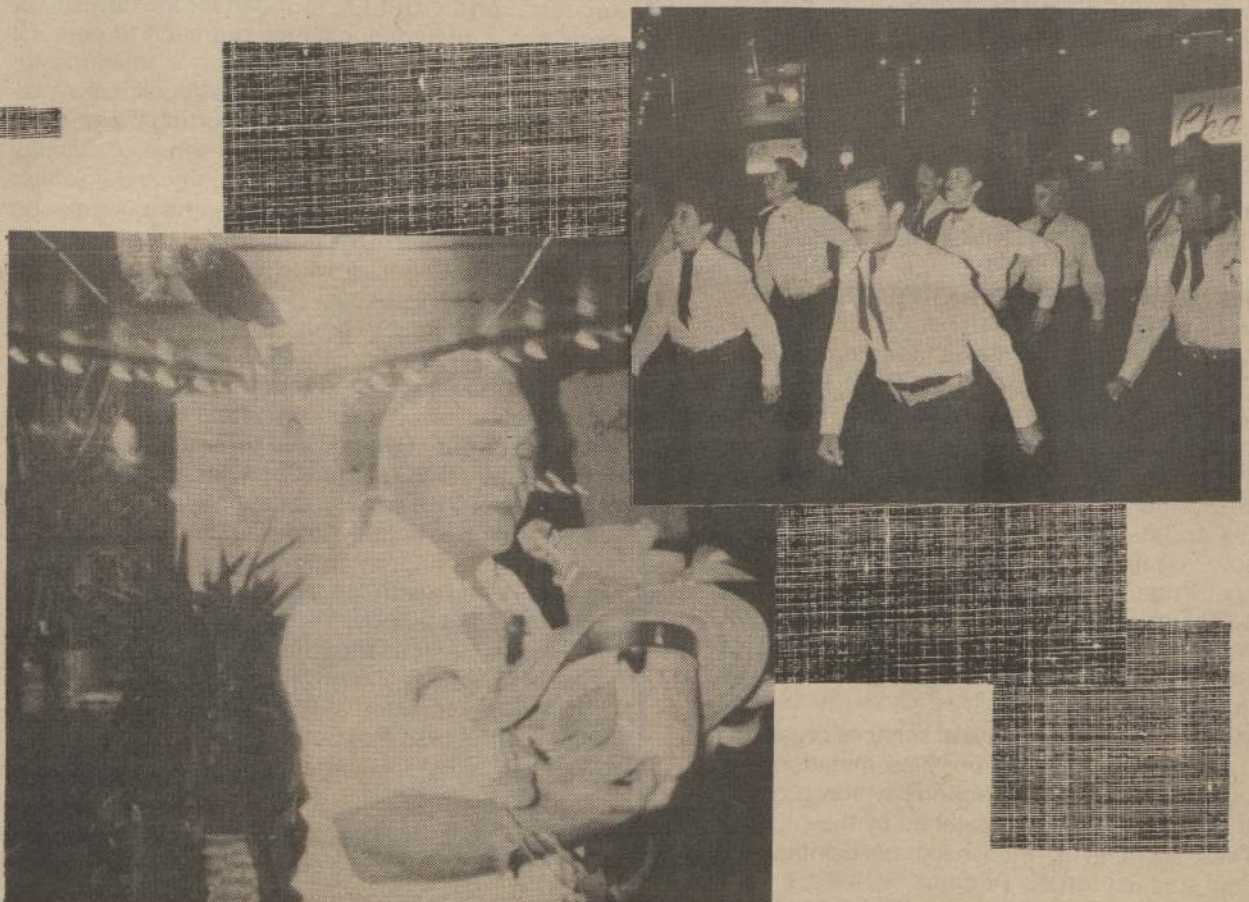

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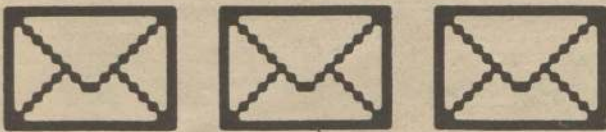

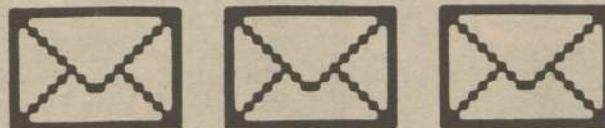
