CON CON AND H.L.A.

THREATS TO AMERICAN FREEDOM

Have you heard of the Con Con? No, it's not a new dance (that was the Can CAN). A Con Con is the most dangerous threat to our lifestyles that has been discussed in the two hundred years since the forming of the United States of America. According to the US Constitution (Article V), Congress with 2/3 of both Houses agreeing can propose an amendment to the Constitution. Another way, which has never been tried before, is when 2/3 of the State Legislatures (34 States) pass a resolution requiring Congress to set up a Constitutional Convention (Con Con) for the purpose of proposing an amendment. Either way, 3/4 of the State Legislatures (38 States) must ratify the amendment for it to become part of the Constitution.

The amendment which is being proposed is the *Human Life Amendment (HLA)*. If passed, the HLA would make abortion illegal under all circumstances. It will put abortion back into the dirty streets and back alleys as it was before the 1973 Supreme Court ruling stating that abortion laws in most States were unconstitutional. Since 1973, there has been an organized attempt to make abortion illegal again. See page 2 for a related story on the HLA.

Even if you happen to be one of the few gay/lesbian/straight people who, despite the facts, believe that a woman who becomes pregnant must be forced to carry the unwanted fetus to term, please read on. The Con Con and the HLA can and will affect you and your lifestyle.

Nineteen States have already passed on a Con Con. On Feb 2, HCR 2002, Az's Con Con proposal, died in the Senate Judiciary Committee. The immediate threat, at least in Az, has been averted. Next year, however, the Con Con will be introduced again. The reason a Con Con is so dangerous is that there are no rules governing it. There is no guarantee that the Con Con must or will stick to the one issue for which it was convened. In fact, the New Right is hoping that the Con Con will rewrite the Constitution. They want to see gay lifestyles, cohabitation, abortion, and other "religious sins" outlawed in the US Constitution. They would like to see a national religion written into the Constitution. They want to eliminate the current "Bill of Rights". The New Right fanatics are very vocal about what they want and they are working very hard to get their way.

What can you do? You can write your legislators (see pages 16, 25, and 27); tell them that you like the Constitution the way it is; that you are a voter in their district and you are pro-choice. We must make our views known to the people who are making the laws. You cannot sit back and hope; the New Right is organized--we must be at least that organized too. The New Right reaches millions of people each week through the Sunday morning TV sermons, such as Jerry Falwell's *Old-Time Gospel Hour*. The audience of those types of shows are "sending in part of their Social Security checks", according to Falwell, to support the religious fanatics.

Now is the time to counter the anti-gays, the anti-choice, the anti-live-and-let-live, hateful-religious people who would rather see us dead or in jail than out on the streets "flaunting our lifestyles" by living out of the closets. We need to take action--and we need to do it now. Use the postcards on the last page. Write your message and send it in.

H.L.A: A WOMAN'S BODY IS PUBLIC PROPERTY!

In 1973, the United States Supreme Court ruled that laws making abortion a crime, under most circumstances, were unconstitutional. The Court said that abortion during the first six months of pregnancy should be a decision between a woman and her doctor, and that a woman could have an abortion during the last trimester of pregnancy if her health were endangered.

The insert to the right is the complete text of the *Human Life Amendment*. Section 1 defines *person* to include the fetus from the moment of conception. Section 2 prohibits abortion except to save the life of the mother. Section 3 is the normal paragraph giving the power to Congress and the states to pass laws to enforce the amendment.

When the US Senate Subcommittee on Constitutional Amendments held a year of hearings in 1974-75, topics were clarified regarding the HLA. The HLA requires the fetus to be considered a person even when the mother does not know it exists. The HLA would radically alter laws so that the fetus would have full constitutional rights. Those rights would be superior to the rights of the mother.

Every miscarriage or spontaneous abortion would be investigated under criminal law. The woman would be investigated for MURDER. A woman's life would be subordinate to that of the unborn fetus. Certain restrictions on the pregnant woman's life would be imposed to insure no damage could be done to the unborn. Travel, work and other restrictions are probable to "safeguard the baby maker". Birth control devices, such as the Pill and the IUD, would become illegal since they prevent the implantation of the fertilized egg.

The HLA would set birth control, sex education, and women's rights back to the pre-1900's. Don't let Jerry Falwell, the Moral Majority, the Mormon Church, et al, send us into another Dark Ages. Write your legislators today!

Section 1. With respect to the right to life, the word person as used in this article and in the Fifth and Fourteenth Articles of Amendment to the Constitution of the United States applies to all human beings irrespective of age, health, function or condition of dependency, including their unborn offspring at every stage of their biological development.
Section 2. No unborn person shall be deprived of life by any person; provided however, that nothing in this article shall prohibit a law permitting only those medical procedures required to prevent the death of the mother.
Section 3. The Congress and the several states have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.

BELLEVUE 2 I

Charges of trespassing were dropped by the Mormon Church against the "Bellevue 2 I" who chained themselves to the gates of a Mormon temple being dedicated in Bellevue, Washington.

The Church must have had too many skeletons in the closet to risk being questioned under oath. As soon as Church officials were subpoenaed, the charges were dropped", stated one of the protesters. Another added, "Their official reason for dropping the charges was 'live and let live', we only wish they had 'let live' before sinking untold numbers of dollars into anti-ERA campaigns". There are continuing efforts to inform the public on the intrusions of the Mormon church into the political arena, in violation of its tax status.. For more info, contact NOW at 968-5533.

DAY CARE NOT WELFARE

Last year, Bill Jamieson, DES Director, underestimated the amount of money that would be needed for Day Care subsidies for the fiscal year of 1980-81. The State's Day Care program pays a portion of the regular day care cost for families with children who make less than 75% of the State's median income. The amount the State pays depends on the family income and the number of children.

Several bills have been debated this year to support the DES Day Care program. At the present time, HB2016 with the \$3.1 million provision needs to pass in order that working mothers can continue to work and not be on welfare. If funds are cut for higher levels, then it would be more profitable for a mother to stay home and get welfare than for her to work. If you are concerned and want to see people work instead of getting welfare, write your representatives that you support HB2016 with \$3.1 million.

PERMIT GRANTED: COMMUNITY SUPPORTS MARCH

The first candlelight march for lesbian and gay rights in Phoenix will be held during Gay Pride Week despite earlier objections from Valley police.

Preliminary hurdles were cleared when attorney Dianne Post, with the help of the Phx City Council, overcame police objections that the march lacked "community-wide interest". A permit has been granted for the march, which will begin at dusk, Saturday, June 27, at Patriot's Park (Central and Washington) and head west towards the State Capitol (17th Ave. and Washington).

Although marches to focus attention on lesbian and gay civil rights have been held in other cities, this will be Phoenix's first. Reaction in the gay community has been mixed. "Initially, there was some resistance to the idea of the march," Ed Osterhout, co-chair of the march committee along with Lydia Javins.

"Some members of the gay community were afraid of the backlash that would come from anti-gay groups as a result of the publicity," Ms. Javins explained. "We are now getting support for the march from a variety of individuals and organizations who are not primarily gay, but who want to stand up and be counted as supporters of gay civil rights."

"With the support we are getting from non-gay groups, gay people should not be afraid to come to the march," gay activist Bj Bud said. "No guts, no glory!"

Phoenix NOW President Baker explains her views on participation in a lesbian and gay rights march: "Everyone who believes in the notion of equality should be willing to be in that march to say 'I may not (or I may) be gay, but liberty is an indivisible right, and is not to be reserved for some and withheld from others.'"



"This march signals a long-awaited beginning for NOW's active and vigorous campaign to join with the gay community to work for lesbian and gay civil rights in Arizona," said Arlie Scott NOW President Pat Bramlette.

Homemaker and mother of two, Lea Goodman sums up the feeling of many non-gays: "If those Moral Majority types want to come to the march to hassle gays, they're going to have to climb over me to do it!"

CBS ZAPPED BY NNC

The National News Council, in a rare move, has faulted CBS News as "unfair" in part because of the way it portrayed gays in its documentary *Gay Power, Gay Politics*.

The Council, which acts as an unofficial judge of media ethics, found that the documentary dealt unfairly with sadomasochism and other sexual aspects of gay life.

The 18-member council of media executives in its report said: "By concentrating on certain flamboyant examples of homosexual behavior, the program tended to reinforce stereotypes." It added that the program "exaggerated political concessions to gays and made those concessions appear as threats to public morals and decency."

In particular the Council criticized the program for implying that sado-masochism is distinctively homosexual.

The Council contradicted host Harry Reasoner, who said that gays were demanding "absolute sexual freedom."

"The reality," said the Council, "is that homosexuals are not monolithic in their behavior or their political objectives. Many abhor public sex; their principal objective is a climate of tolerance that permits them to operate in the mainstream of their communities."

FBI & POLICE ABUSE

NGTF is asking every gay person who is a victim of police brutality to report the incident to the local office of the Federal

Bureau of Investigation and to NGTF (call or write Tom Burrows, NCTF, 80 Fifth Ave, NY, NY 10011; 212/741-5800). NGTF will monitor reported cases of police brutality thru the Civil Rights Division of the Justice Dept to see that the complaint receives the attention it deserves throughout the investigative process. "We know that complaints are the key element in our effort to focus federal attention on police abuse of gay people," commented NGTF's Tom Burrows. "So far both the FBI and Justice Dept have been very cooperative and we urge gay people who have a legitimate complaint to act. It is in their interest and for the benefit of all of us."





SEPARATION

Gov. Jerry Brown told a largely gay audience that he felt the 'Moral Majority's influence in the Reagan Administration would begin to decline after the first six months because of all the pressure that would be put on the White House. Brown compared the fate of the Moral Majority to that of McCarthyism under President Eisenhower, noting that Eisenhower's election left McCarthy with no White House to attack. Brown felt the Moral Majority would be unable to effectively attack their own candidate, Ronald Reagan. The Governor said that the world is changing rapidly and nations are becoming extremely competitive economically. In that competitive environment, he said, we simply cannot afford to waste anyone's talent - whether they are black, gay women or Chicano.

65 RETIREMENT?

On Jan. 20, Ronald Reagan, 17 days short of his 70th birthday, will become the oldest U.S. president at the time of his inauguration. He will be the third oldest president ever, but not for long. There's good news and bad news for women from the transition team of president-elect Ronald Reagan. First the good news. *The Christian Science Monitor* reports that Ronald Reagan's talent scouts are looking for a woman to be the White House press secretary. Now, the bad news: At the same time Reagan's people search for a woman to fill the press slot, they also say they plan to downgrade the press secretary role. Edwin Meese, III, a top Reagan advisor, says Reagan has made it clear he does not want an "up front" press secretary, such as Jody Powell and some of his predecessors have been.

REACTION POSITIVE

Ronald Reagan's election to the presidency has apparently spawned a nationwide surge of support for civil rights and other liberal organizations. Since Nov. 4, groups such as the National Organization for Women, the American Civil Liberties Union, and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People report their memberships have been mushrooming. The NAACP says that in just the past six weeks, it has added 17,200 members to its ranks. NOW reports gaining 12,000 new members in November alone. And the New York headquarters of the ACLU says it is receiving contributions at the rate of about 500 letters a day. Most people who are joining the organizations, according to the *New York Times*, are doing so because they fear the real threat to gains made in the areas of civil liberties, women's rights and minority causes under the in-coming administration. The *Times* adds that various civil rights groups are now attempting to shape a unified plan to block conservative moves on civil liberties issues in much the same way the new right successfully blocked liberal candidates. Says John Shattuck, legislative director of the ACLU, "People are pulling together and there's no question of a renewed interest in civil rights and civil liberties. The phone hasn't stopped ringing."

Harrisburg, PA--A planning meeting was held recently for a statewide Moral Majority organization for Pennsylvania. One of the ministers in attendance reported the following statements of Robert Billings, a top aide to the Rev Jerry Falwell and a liaison between the fundamentalist-Right and the Reagan campaign. "I know what you and I feel about these queers, these fairies," Billings is quoted as saying. "We wish we could get in our cars and run them down while they march." Later, Billings said, "We need an emotion-charged issue to stir people up and get them mad enough to get up from watching TV and do something. I believe that the homosexual issue is the issue we should use."

Lynchburg, VA--Jerry Falwell's latest mailing has a new twist. Enclosed is a sealed envelope, with explicit instructions "not to open" until the kids are out of the room. It also suggests that the contents be destroyed "so that it won't fall into the hands of an innocent youngster." In the envelope is a page of reprinted paragraphs from a sex-education textbook, which includes mention of the 1973 decision by the American Psychiatric Assoc that homosexuality is not a mental illness.

San Diego, CA--What does the Moral Majority want in San Diego? According to its election material, it approves of wiretapping for marijuana offenses, stiffer marijuana penalties, prosecution for sale of requested pornography, repeal of the consenting adults law, an end to sex-change for transsexuals, an end to the over-the-counter sale of prophylactics, no sale of contraceptives to minors without parental consent, teachers fired for failing to notify students' parents of coming sex education classes, children legally required to support parents in old age, unmarried cohabiting adults denied conciliation court services, tougher requirements for divorce, an end to abortion funding for women whose lives are in danger, and students released from public school to attend religion class.

Washington, DC--Organized crime is getting some competition, at least in the "hit list" department. First the Moral Majority

said it was targeting, and managed to help defeat in the last election, a number of liberal senators and congress members. Now, the National Committee for an Effective Congress says it has a list of conservative congress members it will work to defeat in the 1982 election. Included on the list were several winners of house elections last month who have not taken office. The Committee says it drew up the hit list because the organization "feels" it is time that progressive Americans realize that the conservatives are on the verge of controlling the entire federal government. Among those on the list are Senators S.I. Hayakawa, William Roth and Richard Lugar; and house members Don Clausen, Robert Dornen and Eugene Chappie.

FICA RISES

Social Security taxes in 1981 will be higher than those in 1980. In accordance with the Social Security Act schedule of wage bases and tax rates enacted in 1977, the 1981 payroll tax rate will rise from 6.13 percent to 6.65 percent for both employee and employer. The 1981 earnings base will be \$29,700, up from \$25,900 in 1980.

PRESCRIPTION SPERM

Human sperm has been officially classified as a prescription drug by a Canadian pharmaceutical group in order for artificial-insemination patients to qualify for treatment under Canada's Medicare program. According to *American Medical News*, the Order of Pharmacists of Quebec decided, after "lengthy philosophical debate", that sperm used for insemination could be designated a prescribable medicine.

One problem, the superintendent told the school board, was whether or not to give the Genesis account of creation and, then, whose version of Genesis to use.

TAXES WASTED

The US Navy has dropped charges against the last four women sailors accused of lesbian activities aboard the missile test ship, USS Norton Sound.

In the four cases previously brought before the Administrative Discharge Board, the Navy was able to win discharges on only two sailors. They were given general discharges. The other two were reinstated after the board found no evidence that they had engaged in Lesbian activity.

The American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), which has represented all 8 women, has announced its intention to appeal the discharge verdict.

Boston, MA--After refusing to hear testimony from the lesbian and gay community, a committee making recommendations for public access to cable television gave its final approval Dec 1 to a list of 17 minority and special interest groups to be included in the monitoring public access--a list which omits the lesbian/gay community. Four committee members said they will submit a minority report urging that lesbians and gay men be included.



HOORAY FOR HOLLYWOOD



Four years ago, Hollywood presented a world in which homosexuality did not exist. Homosexuals seldom appeared unless they were the main subject of a picture, so the general public would know which movies to avoid. When homosexuals were the main subject, the picture was almost sure to be either a grim, sordid drama or a comedy that got its laughs with loud and brassy display of negative stereotypes.

Since the middle of 1977, at least 32 pictures have come out of Hollywood with characters acknowledged to be gay in so many words. Andrew Sarris, probably the most respected American film critic, has reviewed certain movies specifically as to how they relate to gay issues. Charles Champlin went so far as to write about gay film as a genre in the Los Angeles Times. "Homosexuality" and "lesbianism" are given as subjects in the *Filmgoers Companion*. *All That Jazz*, *The Goodbye Girl*, and other movies with visible and significant gay subplots have made millions at the box office, while the gay audience has proven how vital it can be to the sustained success of cult films like *The Rocky Horror Picture Show*, *Outrageous*, and *Fame*. Gays have also shown themselves to be actively concerned with how they are depicted in such projects as *Cruising* and *Windows*.

Will the gay presence in film continue to expand in the coming year and decade? This depends on two factors. Of

those 32 pictures, gays were the main characters in only eight. People who wouldn't go to a movie about homosexuals are seeing gay subplots and supporting characters in movies that they went to see for the music, comedy, drama or violence. To some film makers and some fraction of the audience, it's becoming dishonest and unrealistic to depict the world without reference to gays. But gay subplots are often too minor or too controversial to report in advance. At this writing, only three films set for 1981 release have reported gay themes. According to *Rolling Stone*, gay sex is one of the discoveries Ringo Starr makes when he stars in the prehistoric comedy, *Cave-man*. James Coco plays Marsha Mason's gay friend, an unsuccessful actor, in *Only When I Laugh*. That picture was adapted from *The Gingerbread Lady*, Neil Simon's comic drama that was staged on Broadway in 1970. And the sequel to *La Cage Aux Folles* is due from Europe in April.

The other unknown factor is just which projected films will make it to the screen. Two pictures that focus on lesbians are now filming, but *Personal Best* severed its ties with Warner Brothers during the actors' strike and hasn't yet been offered to other distributors. Patty Duke Astin and Sara Botsford portray lesbians who decide to have a child in *By Design*. This independently-made comedy is now filming in Toronto.



LEGISLATIVE FOCUS

The Arizona State Legislature is in session each year from the middle of January to the middle or end of April. Each year, the 90 legislatures (3 from each of the 30 districts in the State) discuss a multitude of bills, many which die a painless death in committee. Others, however, get passed by one group (such as the Senate) but cannot get passed by the other (such as the House). Still others get as far as the Governor who vetos the bill. If a bill gets passed by Gov Babbit, it becomes LAW.

This year, as in past years, there are a lot of DUMB bills in the legislature. There is, surprisingly, a few GOOD bills. Each Sunday, the Arizona Republic prints a list of the bills which the Senate and the House will be discussing that week. The list can be found in Section B, usually around page 6. If you want a copy of the bill, you can call 255-4133. This is a FREE taxpayer's service. Below is a summary of some of the bills being discussed now. If you call or write your representative about a bill, be sure to state its number.

HB 2078--Raises minimum drinking age to 21.

HB 2066--Prohibits state transportation director from distributing free copies of *Arizona Highways* magazine to libraries, schools, hotels, visitors, etc.

HB 2053--Expands tax exemptions for non-profit charitable organizations to include leases and purchases.

HB 2049--Imposes \$15 civil penalty for each bad check submitted by taxpayer to Department of Revenue.

HB 2061--Requires junkyards to be screened from outside view.

HB 2065--Expands requirement that a driver control his speed to avoid colliding with a person or vehicle on highway to include any object on or adjacent to highway.

HB 2127--Makes it a felony to misrepresent details in the sale of insurance.

HB 2082--Increase state treasurer revolving fund from \$15,000 to \$50,000.

HB 2016--Appropriates money to Dept of Economic Security for day care.

SB 1033--Requires director of Dept of Health Services to select either Ranegras Valley or Rainbow Valley as the site for hazardous-waste-disposal facility.

SB 1025--Requires group hospitalization insurance policies to provide coverage for breast-reconstruction surgery stemming from mastectomy.

SB 1022--Changes names of Game and Fish Dept and Game and Fish Commission to Wildlife Dept and Wildlife Commission.

SB 1014--Limits enrollment of students from certain foreign countries.

FOCUS (continued)

HB 2056--Prohibits person convicted of sexual assault from receiving suspended sentence, probation, pardon or parole.

HB 2088--Adds to list of racketeering crimes involving obscenity, child pornography and prostitution.

HB 2093--Provides that overpaid welfare recipient is liable for amount of overpayment and can be taken to court by the state.

HB 2106--Outlaws equipment and material used in illicit production or taking of drugs.

HB 2113--Provides that professional nurse who obtains master's degree could be identified as nurse practitioner.

HB 2128--Provides that benefits could not be denied under health-insurance contracts for chiropractic services.

HB 2035--Permits state to buy recycled paper if cost does not exceed 5% of cost of regular paper.

HB 2055--Provides that income from interest up to \$1,000 may be subtracted from gross income for state tax purposes.


HB 2099--Provides for confiscation of vehicle driven by intoxicated person.

HB 2124--Requires that price of gasoline and diesel fuel be posted by gallon.

HB 2075--Prohibits state Board of Education from permitting common school district to offer high school course that has been rejected by voters within the past 5 years.

SB 1068--Makes it illegal to carry child younger than 4 in vehicle without strapping him in child-restraint system.

SB 1111--Provides that during second regular sessions, individual legislation could not introduce more than five bills, memorials or resolutions, except with Rules Committee permission.



BOOKS CENSORED IN LOCAL SCHOOLS

There were two articles in *The Arizona Republic*, Sunday, Jan. 25, dealing with censorship and conservative parents' concerns over textbook contents. We're glad the paper printed these stories and is trying to bring this problem to the attention of others.

A Thatcher High librarian has witnessed the disappearance of more than 150 books and the censorship of 40 books by order of the district superintendent. The librarian said she "understood the books were taken by a conservative parents' group who got into the library on weekends and after school." One book, *The Reincarnation of Peter Proud* was taken from a student while he was in class.

Educators are in agreement that all views should be presented, but are swayed by community pressures to limit liberal interests. Their aim is "to help students learn how to think comprehensively and be self-governing citizens by age 18."

Still, parents are objecting and having removed from schools (sometimes over the objections of other parents) books they feel are detrimental to their children's learning.

It seems things are going too far, though, when *Huckleberry Finn* and *Mary Poppins*, even *The American Heritage Dictionary* are coming under attack.

Mrs. Nilson, a library science teacher, says, "Parents' reasoning is that if children don't know the meaning of these things (whether it's masturbation, homosexuality or sexual language) they won't participate."

School boards are not casual about their responsibility to select reading material. It's a drawn-out process into which a lot of thought and deliberation is put.


GAY BOOKS DONATED

Watch repairs if wearing a watch is required by employer.

Expenses for research necessary for a professor to teach, lecture and write in her field.

Union-initiation fees when required to obtain employment.



Legal fees to keep employment.

SPANISH RIGHTS

Mounting pressure from a wide range of groups has forced the Spanish government to recognize formally the *Catalan Gay Liberation Front* (FAGC). This marks the first time that Spain has officially recognized a gay organization.

WILLI BRANT - RIGHTS

Hamburg, West Germany--Former Chancellor Willi Brant, chairperson of the *German Social Democratic Party*, for the first time took a stand on the issue of discrimination against homosexuals. Brant stated that if reelected as a member of Parliament, he would recommend to the *Federal Diet* that homosexuals who were incarcerated in Nazi concentration camps receive compensation. He also said it was time homosexuals were treated as equally as heterosexuals under the law.

HOLOCAUST

Baltimore, MD--A handful of gay protestors joined a Nov 2 memorial service for victims of the Holocaust. The demonstrators carried signs reading "250,000 homosexuals were killed in the Holocaust, just because they were gay."

VD PREVENTION

Paris, France--Fifty prostitutes in France have volunteered for a medical test of a new cream that will protect them and their customers against venereal disease. The French experiment was reported at a scientific symposium by Dr Malcolm Potts, executive director of the *International Fertility Research Program*. In a one-year long study, these female prostitutes will use a sperm-killing vaginal cream called nonoxyenal-9. The cream is a powerful killer of germs and is effective against the organisms that cause treponema infections, gonorrhea, and venereal herpes, according to Potts. The new cream is of interest to women because it is also a contraceptive and to gays because of the chance of venereal disease thru multiple sexual contacts.

FULL ACCEPTANCE

Amsterdam, The Netherlands--The *Reformed Churches in the Netherlands* have decided to admit homosexuals as fully accepted members. The decision was made by a nearly unanimous vote and covers both the orientation and practice of Christian homosexuals.

ANZAC DAY SUPPORT

Auckland, New Zealand--The annual ANZAC Day service in Auckland was marked by memorial wreaths laid by a group of lesbians thought to be members of the *Lesbian Liberation Army* and also by representatives from Auckland Gay Rights Activists. The card on the lesbian wreath read: "We are not celebrating. We are mourning--for the women of all nationalities who lost their lives in the wars of men--for women who were raped, maimed, persecuted and who suffered thru the aggression of men. We do not support the glorification of war. We do not consider murderers and rapists [to be] heroes."

The AGRA wreath in the form of a simple pink triangle of flowers stated: "In memory of all Lesbians and Gay men who gave their lives so that we may live in peace and understanding and to the many thousands who suffered and died in the German death camps." Both wreath attracted a lot of public attention, but no adverse reactions.

RIGHT ON

Amsterdam, The Netherlands--A popular bumper sticker in Holland these days reads: "Heterosexuality--No Thanks".

WRITE OFF

Ontario, Canada--Ontario-based evangelist and anti-gay crusader Ken Campbell is a director of the Anita Bryant Ministries, and he says that if Bryant hadn't insisted on the name change, he would have. Campbell claims that he was "taken for a ride" by Bryant when he organized her Canadian anti-gay tour in 1978, and he confessed to his Churchhill Heights Baptist congregation in Scarborough that he has "considerable doubt whether she (Bryant) has ever met the Lord."


