## PR PERSONAL PROFILE

**"JIM AND SHELLEY"**

After their recent engagement at Taylor's, we had the privilege of sharing a few casual hours with Shelly Taylor Kiss and brother, Jim Fredericks. Young, successful, levelheaded people who have retained values gained on each rung of the ladder on their way up, Jim and Shelly are inspirational figures in this world of ups and downs. Not that they are shielded from day to day pressures, genuine open minds and hearts such as these sometimes open the wrong doors, however through a serious dedication to their work and comfort in sibling bond, they practice the fine art of keeping too busy to dwell too long on life's letdowns. In their professional lives, they set realistic goals for six to twelve month periods, once these have been attained, they implement new, well thought out plans. In five years time, this practice has taken them from their training grounds, a tiny upstairs lounge at a neighborhood pub in New Haven, Connecticut, to California recording studios by way of a multitude of cabaret appearances for a wide variety of audiences. Shelley's beautiful and versatile voice along with that of Jim's and his talented fingers on keyboard, have delighted the young and old, gay and straight with Pop music, ballads and a healthy dash of 'Nuevo-Camp' (Bette Midler non-offensive humor) and pave the way for their current break into 'underground dance' (look for a review of 'Seduction' in next issue's Music Report).

Present goals have Jim spending more time in the studio exercising his genius as producer, writer and arranger... the technical aspects of their launch into the recording industry. Shelly, with background in theatre and psychology (as well as retail experience) is a natural to the promotional side of this new phase. As they complement one another in music, so do they complement one another in business. No longer just 'Jim & Shelley' working the cabaret circuit as a duet, their positive growth together has achieved the growth of individual strengths as well.

Off stage, real life is quickly separated from theatre (so I'm told, though their apparent ease on stage and sincere audience interaction leaves Shelley's absence of stage makeup as primary indicator to the untrained eye). When working together, they travel as a family unit accompanied by Shelley's daughter, Lauren, and pussy cat, Othello. In Arizona, they find an 'incredible life force'. Strong audience contribution furthers their inspiratin to perform. Phoenix is somewhat of a hub of their more serious working world, just far enough removed to allow for positive rejuvenation before continuing their pursuit of current aspirations. As any artists breaking into new territory, they are anxious for honest reponse to their work. They value the Phoenician opinion, so if you are not familiar with their work, ask your D.J. to play "Seduction" and let him or her know your reaction so that it might be passed on ultimately to those most concerned, Jim Fredericks and Shelley Taylor Kiss.

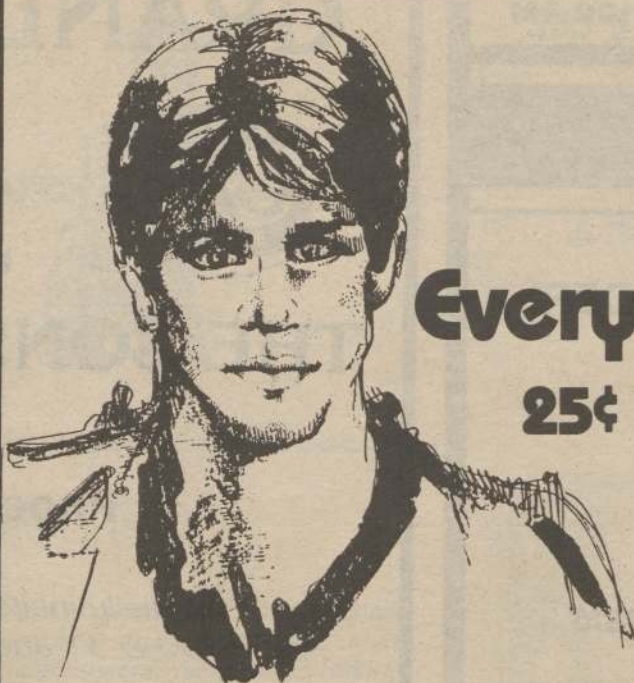

We had a customer in the store last week who has just recently started to purchase leather. He had obviously been giving it a lot of thought because he pretty much knew what he was looking for design-wise and ordered several major items without hesitation. I asked him a couple of times what his friends thought of the additions to his wardrobe and just why he was buying leather now. His answers were never very clear and he didn't seem to take my questions seriously. Maybe he thought I was just making conversation. But I wasn't. It is interesting to talk to someone fresh into leather and discover their particular path to leather and the variety of reactions their journey has produced in those close to them. Each of us that have decided leather, and the feelings that go along with it are important, have our own stories to tell. Where or who or why is interesting but not vital. What is vital is the fact that we have decided, for whatever reasons, that we will demand a certain amount of respect and a firm observance of our shared masculinity.

Leather attitude. Now there's a couple of words. We have a number of people who stop by the shop to "shoot-the-shit" and don't even wear leather. Strange? not really. Leather attitude - masculine attitude - self-assurance. None of it really has much to do with what you wear. The clothing, the jeans, the chaps, harness or vest are just our way of communicating with strangers our attitudes toward ourselves. A way to show how we view ourselves and a desire that they view us the same way. A visual image of our public selves. But the attitude, the belief in ourselves, the self awareness must come from within. A leather vest might enhance your masculine nature but it cannot create it. We take input from friends and family, from things we read and things we see and work them into our daily lives. But ultimately, what we are, especially as adults, is our own responsibility. If we find something lacking, some facet of our character undesirable, we must take whatever action is required to improve our own feelings towards ourselves. 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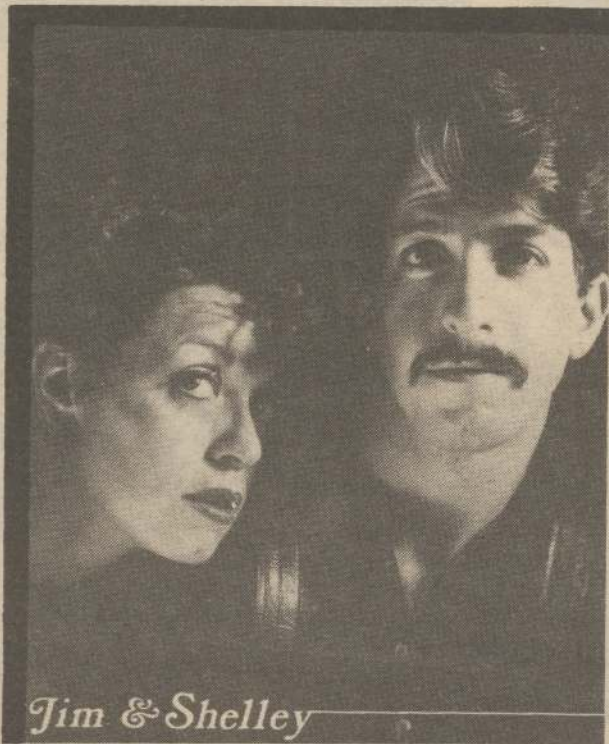

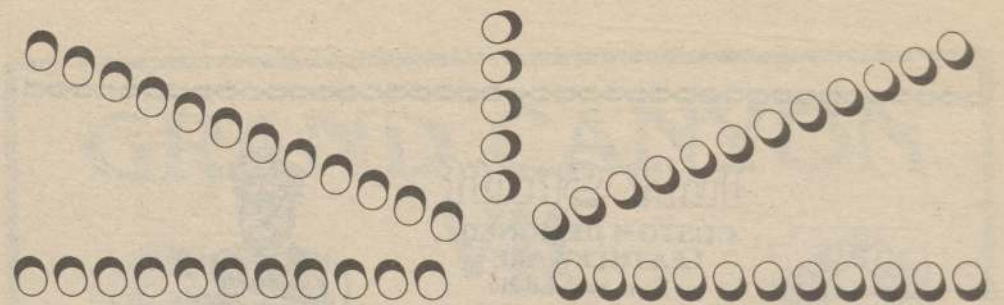
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## PR ENTERTAINMENT REVIEW

The movie section is so much more interesting now. Lots of pictures and poses and drawings and 'bold' type and bold 'hype' and an occasional brief quote of critical comment, favorable of course. Better known locally as the "Leisure and the Arts", the title belies the fact that a person needs a pair of jet-powered roller skates and the constitution of an ox to make it around to all the new openings. A body has to be a true die-hard or seriously indiscriminate to accomplish such a feat. To help simplify matters, some make a distinction between the films they dash out and see on the big screen and those they wait to view at home on videocassette. An admirable idea at first glance. Considering some of the unabashed "gulping gourmets" and "chatty Charlies" that I have had to endure being seated next to, I might be the first to embrace the comfort of your living room sofa as a peaceful alternative. Goodness knows I didn't think anyone would need a blow-by-blow description of the likes of "View to a Kill." (No truth to the rumor that I told the guy to hush - I simply turned around and stared daggers.) All in all it must be remembered in the event that you invite me over for an evening of video viewing — it just might be old stuff by then - puff, puff.

Time was that suffering the indignity of standing in long lines was an acceptable part of the whole adventure of movie-going. That was when the moguls of moviedom would pick a release they deemed worthy of a single screen showing. It made it all somehow special. It generated excitement - and lines. Apparently nothing rates that sort of treatment this season. And indeed it has been some time since anything remotely resembling a "blockbuster" has appeared to coerce me into camping out for a good seat. There are no Lucas spectaculars on the horizon. (Even Mr. Spielberg has taken life a little easier by letting others do most of the work while he writes the stories and attaches his name to the productions.) (Re-releases of 'Gremlins' and Groan Home - 'E.T.' do not count.) More on him another time. At any rate, there are movies coming out of the woodwork, ladies and gentlemen. I soon wearied of the assortment of male idols over the age of twelve that there is to choose from. So when in doubt I blindly pursue the 'imported' stuff. And if it features a classy 'dame' - that's even more incentive. And if she - and the production, obviously - are British, that means I'll understand 'most' of what they are saying. I tend to wax poetic sometimes. Even more so after listening to the Queen's language for more than a few hours. Before I launch into the following, I think I shall imbibe a calumet so as to mellow oneself.

'A Private Function' stars Michael Paline and Maggie Smith. He is better known for his 'Monty Python' gigs. Thankfully his character here is totally in control. Ms. Smith plays his wife. If her upper lip got any stiffer it would crack her face. He plays with feet for a living and is content. She wants more out of life and is not content. The story is set just after the War and pork is still a rationed item. A few of the wealthier guys in town are secretly fattening up a pig for an upcoming 'private function' (private party). Michael and Maggie steal the pig and keep it in their two-floor flat (apartment). This will be their ticket to respectability. I don't know about you, but sometimes the British are just plain, well, strange. Maggie's live-in Mum (Mom) wanders around trying to eat anything in sight and the pig gets tummy trouble (squirts). It is a credit to all concerned that it 'is' funny. 'Private Function' is a very cluttered, authentic little piece of British life. Don't worry about those words that whiz by unrecognized - they're only speaking English.

'The Return of the Soldier' has four very interesting folks in the leading roles. Who could resist Alan Bates, Ann Margaret, Julie Christie and especially Glenda Jackson? Wellllll, unless you really get off on these actors and actresses a word of caution. Steamy, dramatic storytelling it ain't. In a nutshell: Alan is a rich guy who lives in a mansion. He is married to Julie. His spinster cousin, Ann Margaret, lives with them. He gets called to do his duty in the War. Julie lounges around the mansion longing for his return. Ann-Margaret wanders around the mansion longing (lusting) for his return. When he finally shows up it is with a real bad case of shell-shock. He is now lusting after Glenda, a lower class girl he screwed in his younger, more carefree days. Julie is not entirely happy with this situation but tolerates the 'other woman's' presence because the shrinks say it might help. Okay fine. There is a little more to the story, but not much. (You know you are in trouble when you go to the snack bar to find out how long the film runs only to realize there is an hour more to sit through.) Glenda is wonderfully 'in character' as usual. Everything else is very low-key. I appreciate calm, dry approaches to a story. This one is hardly breathing. It is very nicely photographed. And you won't miss any of the dialogue because there is so little to trip over. Maybe I'm just jaded. Maybe I'm not romantic enough. Maybe I'm not into 'soaps' that take all night to get to where they are going. Maybe I should have done a Valium before I went.

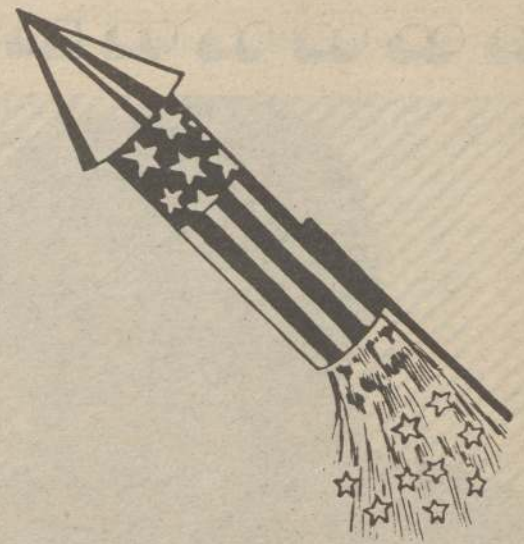




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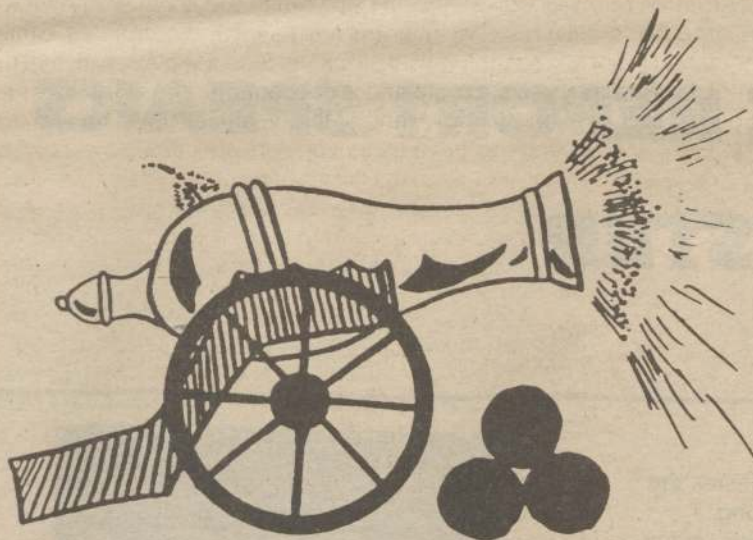
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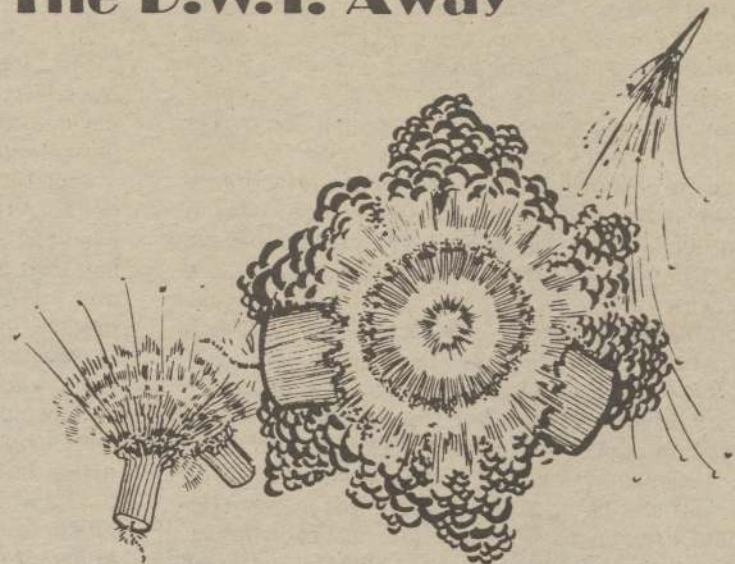
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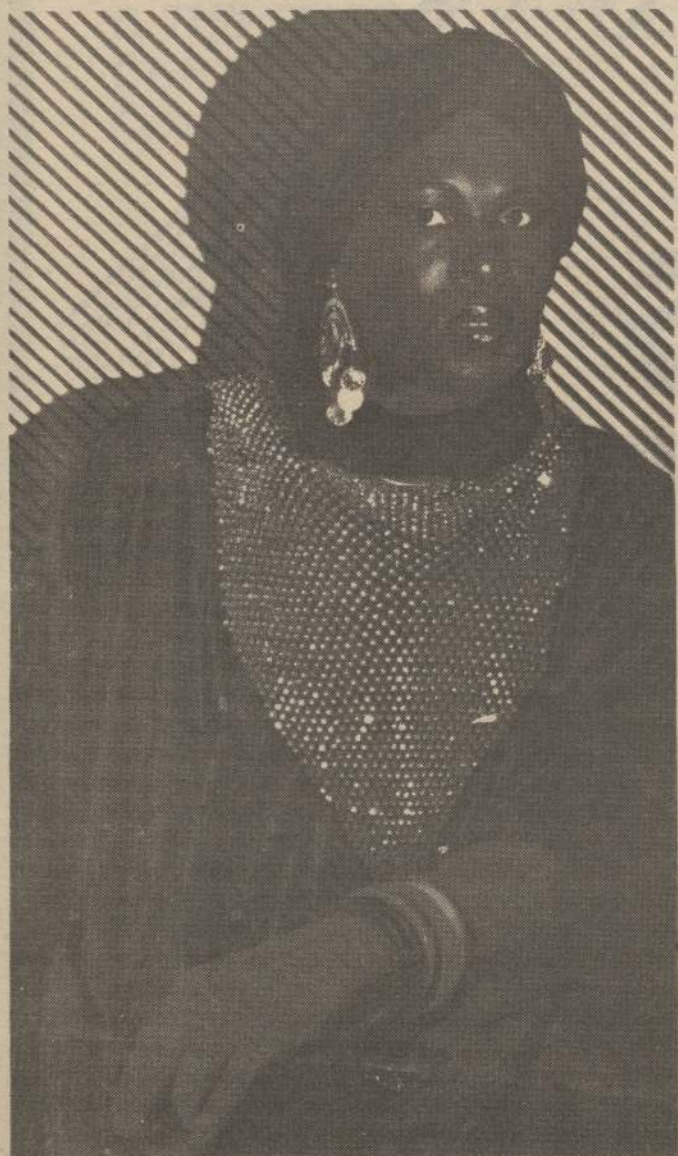
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# THE MUSIC REPORT

ROBERT PELA

*Do you feel that your association with gays, or your Gay-Disco tag has hindered your crossing over, or the success of your records?*

Not at all. My sexuality doesn't enter into it. When I'm having sex, I'm not thinking about music. When I'm singing, I'm not having sex.

My music is more than disco. I have a certain style that my audience has come to expect. I have no problem with Program Directors, or anyone else in this business... it's all about respect. I give it, and I get it in return.

I am quite amazed with what I've gotten away with. In the beginning, people told me I was crazy. I was told that being black was obstacle enough, but that being black and openly gay was craziness. I never thought of these things as limits that I was placing upon myself. I was - and am - being me. And as a result, I get a lot of respect. A great deal more, I think, because of my truthfulness.

*What about the commercial "death of disco" in the early '80's? Did you worry about your fame fading?*

Not in the least. You must remember, I got into the disco end of things rather late. About 1979. I was in South America when it all happened.

me about an hour - and I was done. Very unglamorous.

*There's not much in print about your exit from Fantasy Records. Was yours an amicable departure? What's the story?*

It was... a fantasy... (laughs)

*In 1983, Fantasy released Sylvester's Greatest Hits. How much input did you have into the production of that LP?*

None whatsoever. They (Fantasy) put it together. For me, it was just a business deal.

Fantasy had a song, "Band of Gold," that I had recorded for them but never released. I had gone in and destroyed all the tapes of unreleased things that I had done while with Fantasy. I don't want anybody releasing all this old stuff after I'm dead, you know!

Anyway... I had recorded "Band of Gold" for them, and they had it, and I wanted it. So we worked out a little deal... I gave them permission to include "Do You Wanna Funk" on the Greatest Hits album, if I could release "Band of Gold" on Megatone.

I did, and they did, and it all worked out so nicely... "Band" was a huge hit, and now the vaults are clean.

## MIGHTY REAL: THE MUSIC REPORT SPEAKS WITH SYLVESTER

Upon hearing that I had arranged to interview Sylvester, an associate of mine informed me, "You do not interview Sylvester. He interviews you." I was later to find this forewarning completely unfounded, but in the meantime decided I'd better brush up on my Sylvester... just in case.

Listening to his early recordings, I reminded myself that while Sylvester has always been a man of many stylings, he is known primarily for his dance-floor hits. That while he recorded a number of very diverse albums for the independent Fantasy label between the years 1977 and 1982, he was promoted primarily as a disco singer.

"You Make Me Feel (Mighty Real)", "Dance (Disco Heat)", "Fever." And of course, "Do You Wanna Funk?" Each of them certified hits. But how many remember his splendid re-working of "I (Who Have Nothing)"? Or his renditions of "Loverman" and "Cry Me a River"?

Most of us know him as Disco Sylvester. Many of us are aware that he occasionally performs in drag. But what of the man himself? What is the motivation behind his success? And what about the title of the current Sylvester album, *M-1015*?

**Sylvester:** My lover pointed out that the part number was the same as the release date. We decided that that must mean something... thus the title.

*You mean...*

I came back to the states and was Sylvester the Disco Star. I'd been giving them dance all along...

*At the time of the Death to Disco campaign, many Disco artists attempted to alter their style in order to appeal to a wider audience. While your music has always progressed, I've felt that your style has remained consistent. Do you consider yourself a purist, musically?*

I don't know about that. I do know that there was a dry period. All the really hot dance music was coming from overseas - imported stuff. Nobody here was making that kind of high energy dance music. I was the only one. I gave them what they wanted - and I must say, I made a fortune!

*How do you feel about disco's current "re-birth," i.e., Madonna, Shannon, etc.?*

These children need to wake up and smell the coffee. Disco is not back - it's always been here. Really, it makes me quite sick.

The whole disco thing, when it was a fad, was really tiresome. It's been kind of like a volcanic eruption, you know? We're still feeling the earth tremors of disco's commercial period. You listen to the dance music of today... it's all thump, thump, thump. It's the same music we used to call disco.

*Last year, you appeared on the The Boystown Gang's "Cast of Thousands" LP, which brought together many of the artists from disco's high period. How did it feel to work with all those people again?*

Are you kidding? I never saw any of those people. I rode my bicycle over to the studio. I did my part - took





*You obviously prefer being associated with a dance-oriented label. Do you find that you receive better promotion, better "care" than at a full-line label?*

Well... I do own a portion of Megatone. Therefore, I have more input, more control over what is done with my music.

I really prefer smaller labels. I've turned down offers from the majors. I'm just not interested.

Back at Fantasy I did a lot of what they wanted. And I hated it. Now, I am more completely doing what I want. I'm doing it to my Virgo satisfaction, with no thought to label heads or critics.

*You're not concerned with your critics?*

No. I don't read my reviews. I don't care. I'm more concerned with my audience... with the people, you know? I can party with them, get to know them. Real people. Who parties with their critics?

And I say, who are these people anyway? Just a bunch of judgemental assholes. When they critique me, they're actually judging themselves. "Do not judge lest you be judged yourself." It's in the bible. Check it out.

So I say, "Fuck them!"

*I am a music critic by profession...*

You asked, honey.

*Did you feel a sense of loss, a sort of "end of an era", with the Two Tons becoming The Weather Girls and going on to record for CBS?*

Not at all. I've started many people on their way... but where they go from there is up to them. I've always felt that way.

Marty and Izora... I'm so happy for them. They have a new album all wrapped up. They're doing "Big Girls Don't Cry." You know, their whole concept: Big women, Big songs.

Martha still sings with me. I'm not worried about my back-up singers. Honey, I've got chirpin' children for days! Jeannie (Tracy)... and Nanthaniel Best, he's killer...

*You are able to separate your personal and your professional relationships, then.*

Certainly. I can admire Patti LaBelle, but I can also sit and eat fried chicken with her.

*You don't really eat fried chicken...*

Hell, she cooks it!

*Whose music have you been listening to lately?*

I love Whitney Houston's album. I'm so proud of her. You know, I've known her since she was a tiny thing, singing gospel with her mother. Cissy Houston... she's one of the greatest voices of our time. Whitney, now, she's going to happen. She tells me, "Oh, Syl, I just love you. You're so very..." and I tell her, "Child, you're the one now."

*Of your own albums, do you have a personal favorite?*

The live album. and "Too Hot to Sleep."

And there's more to come. There are things I haven't done yet. Accomplishments I'm capable of. Like I've always said, "Ain't no hairdo high enough..."





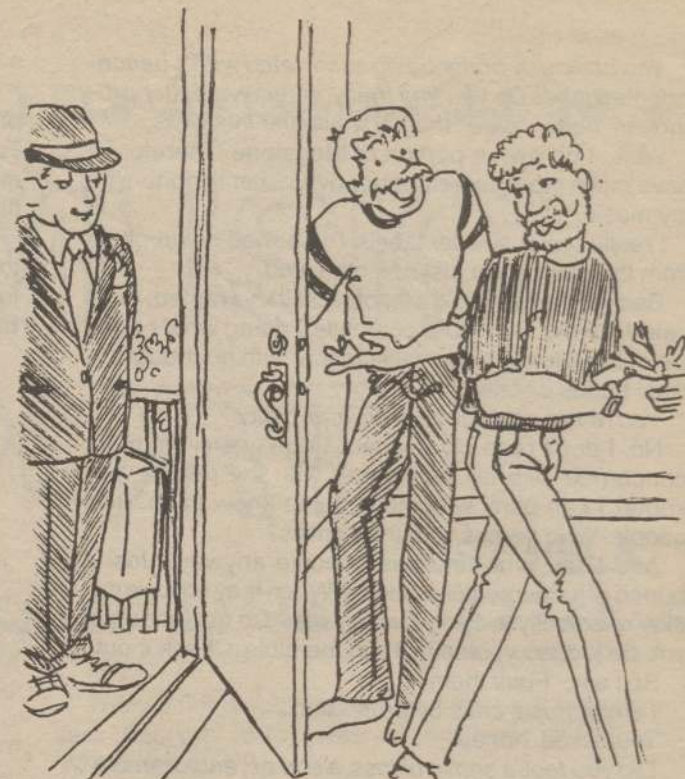
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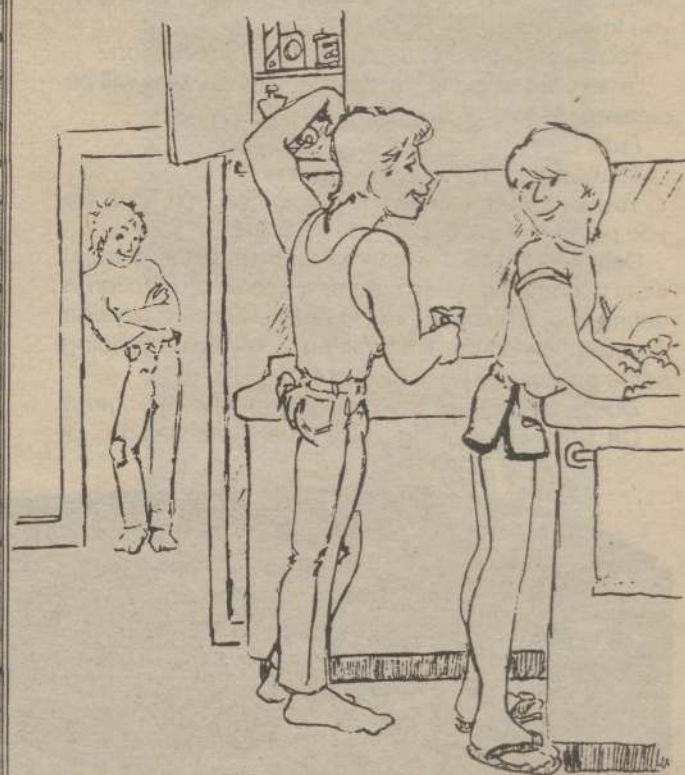

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## OASIS MCC

Oasis Metropolitan Community Church (MCC) of Tempe/Phoenix has officially announced their ambitious building fund campaign. The \$10,000 goal has been set for Memorial Day, May 26, 1986. The fund will enable the church to place a down payment on their own permanent home or structure in the valley area within the year.

Oasis MCC has been conducting services at Danforth Chapel on the Arizona State University campus for approximately five years. Due to the rapid growth of church membership in the past year, it has become necessary to re-evaluate the current use of the smaller chapel space.

Reverend Kay Paolin, founding pastor of Oasis MCC, remarked, "God is calling us to move. There are many gays and lesbians in the valley who do not even know that the Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Community Churches (UFMCC) exists. Our primary outreach is to the gay community with the message that God loves them — unconditionally — just as they are. This is crucial, especially now. People with AIDS are dying and being told that it's God's punishment. We need to provide a place for reaffirming the message that being gay is not a sin. We cannot spread this message and effectively grow until we have a place to call our own."

In the past year, the church has increased the size of its Board of Directors, doubled the number of deacons and student clergy, and has had a 75 percent increase in church attendance.

UFMCC, an international church group that includes over 200 gay congregations in nine countries, recognizes three classifications of churches within its organization — study group, mission and chartered. Oasis MCC began as a seven-member study group in 1979, and now has an average of 35 people in attendance as a mission. To obtain charter status, 35 official members and a commitment to pay a full-time pastor are just two of the prerequisites.

Throughout the year, there will be a number of efforts to raise monies for the building fund, said members of the ad hoc committee charged with this purpose. "The primary goal is to obtain the commitment from our own members to financially support this venture. Concurrently, we will be seeking help from the gay and lesbian communities through outreach programs and solicitation of donations from individuals and organizations."

Currently operating on annual budget of over \$10,000, Oasis MCC will probably double the figure in its next fiscal year, solely for its operating expenses.

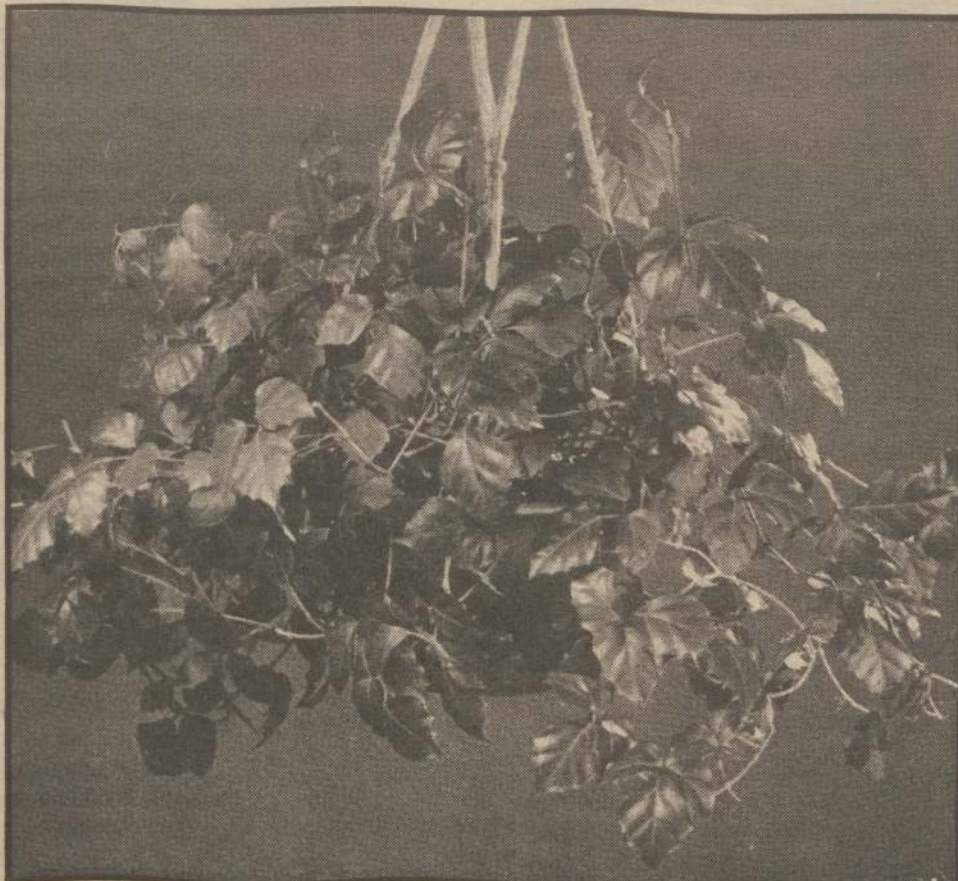

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## DR. GREEN JEANS PLANT CARE



### GRAPE IVY "CISSUS RHOMBIFOLIA"

#### DESCRIPTION:

The Grape Ivy is a vining variety of the grape family, with soft brown stems, coiling tendrils, and glossy-green quilted leaves. As a hanging plant, shoots rise about 18" before cascading down over the sides of the container. The tendrils will grab just about anything for support. This plant makes a great trellis plant since you can train it to grow in just about any shape, i.e. setting the pot in a windowsill and running a couple of pieces of string around the window frame and—with a little help running the new vines on the strings—before you know it your window will have a lush frame of foliage.

#### CARE:

##### Light:

The general rule is medium to light light with no direct sun. However, my experience is to maintain high light levels for the Grape Ivy. There are people who very successfully maintain these plants in low light, so try it where you want it and if you start seeing a problem, change the light situation.

##### Water:

Keep the Grape Ivy moist, not soggy, just moist. These plants grow slowly and leaves will brown if kept too dry.

##### Feeding:

The Grape Ivy does not require a lot of food, so use half doses monthly or just a dash each watering.

##### NOTES:

Grape Ivies can be used as a hanging, table or climbing plant, making them very versatile. If you like the viney look, let them go but if you like a tailored look, tip-pruning keeps the plants full and less wild. Also, once you have a thick mound of foliage, Grape Ivies are shapeable. Have at it, it just takes patience. Grape Ivies also work on covered patios as long as they are watered frequently.

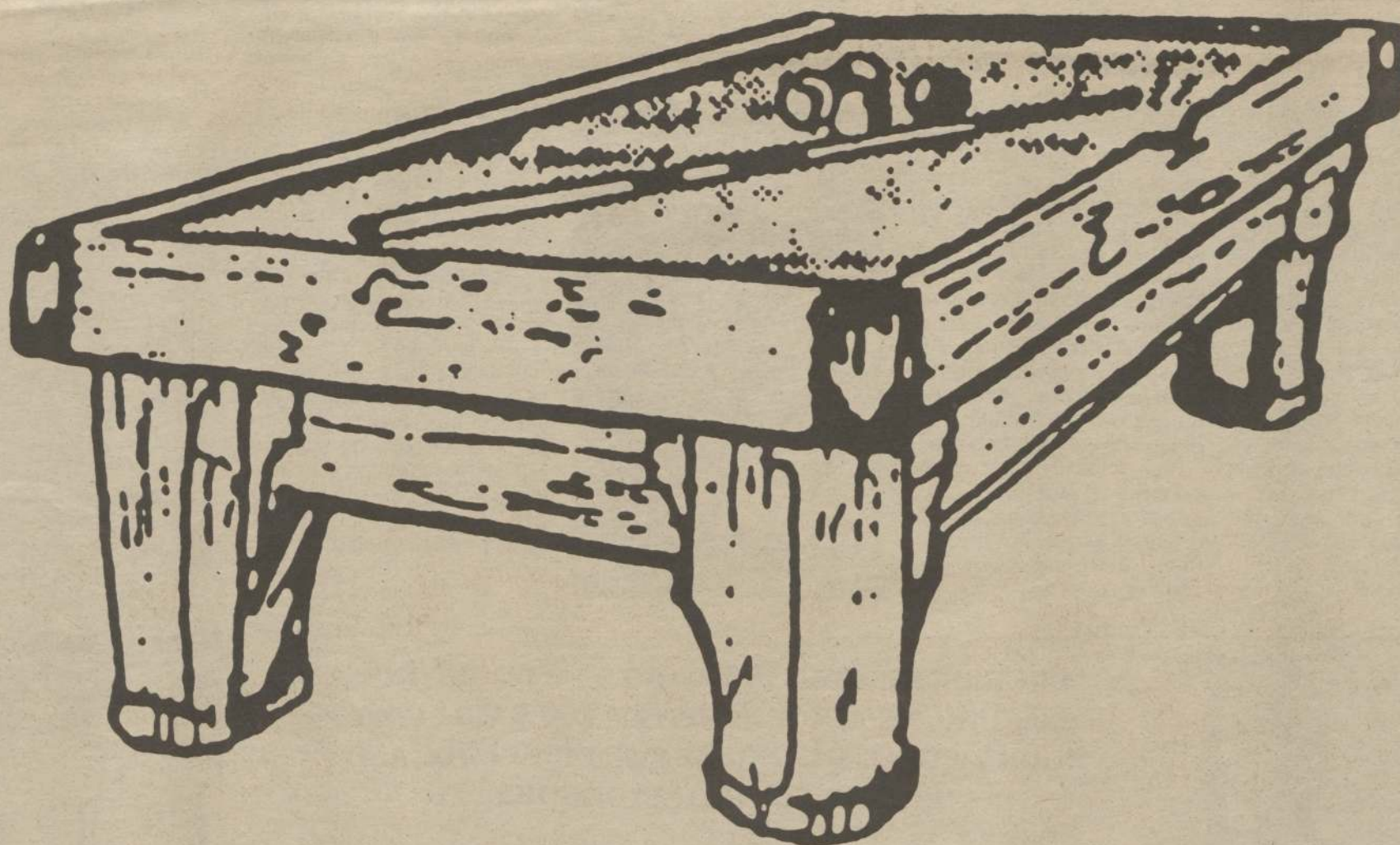

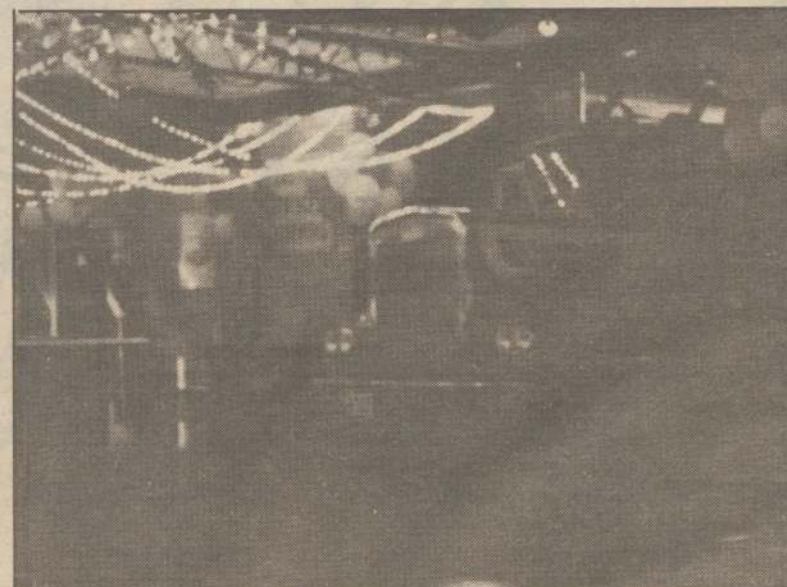
